



“When We Love, We Serve”

Minister Profiles: William Best, Joseph Dorfmeister Lectors-Ministers of the Word

When Our Lady of Lourdes was established in 1956 **Bill Best** and his young family, who had been parishioners of St. Joseph's in Babylon, became founding members of the new parish. Bill and his young bride Marge had moved to the area a few years earlier to begin a family that would eventually include two daughters and two sons.

While the new Church was being built Mass was celebrated in the E.J. Korvettes department store on Sunrise Highway, where Bob's Store now stands. Like many of the members of the new parish, Bill was involved in many ways. He remembers working on a number of building projects with Jim Loretz, the first president of the Holy Name Society at OLL (Bill was the second president). They built the stage in the all purpose room. They cleared and leveled the field that would become the parking lot. Bill even helped out as an alter server at Mass.



The Mass changed as a result of Vatican II. The celebration of the Liturgy of the Word would include scriptures read by lay men and women as well as priests. It seemed only natural that Bill would respond to the call for parishioners to serve as lectors, ministers of the word. With a little training, he became one of the first to proclaim the word at Our Lady of Lourdes.

Upon hearing his booming baritone one might disagree, but Bill claims no special talent or gift as a reader. He believes the lectors' job is to proclaim the readings in a voice that people can understand and relate to. He has been doing just that for a long time.

During a stewardship “time and talent” campaign **Joseph Dorfmeister** filled out a flyer he found on a pew during Mass. He checked the box indicating that he would like to be a lector. A few days later he heard from John Sureau who gave him a brief orientation and then had him added to the schedule. At the time Joe was a ninth grader at West Islip High School. Now a sophomore at St. Joseph's College, Joe is studying to become an elementary school teacher. He continues to be an active member of our parish family and he continues to serve as a minister of the word.

Joe admits to being a little nervous when he began. He found that spending some time preparing during the week made it easier to proclaim the scriptures on Sunday. He also experienced a growing sense that God was with him as he read and this really helped. The experience has been a confidence booster and Joe now feels that he could comfortably speak to any audience.

Joe believes that his active involvement with the word of God has deepened his understanding of God, Jesus and his Church. His reverence for the scriptures is evident. This summer he plans to make his third visit to our sister parish in El Salvador with other young people from the parish and he will bring a bible so that he can share the word with the younger participants from OLL.

As a minister of the word, Joe feels it is his responsibility to bring the scriptures to the congregation in a way that enhances their understanding of them. He believes that, when properly proclaimed, the Word of God can be brought to life by a lector. Hopefully he will continue to do just that for a long time.




Ten Ways to Observe the Year of the Eucharist

(one way to be printed each week in the bulletin)

1. The best way to enter into the mystery of salvation made present in the sacred “signs” remains that of following faithfully the unfolding of the liturgical year. Pastors should be committed to that “mystagogical” catechesis so dear to the Fathers of the Church, by which the faithful are helped to understand the meaning of the liturgy’s word and actions, to pass from its sign to the mystery which they contain, and to enter into that mystery in every aspect of their lives (#17).

The cycle of our liturgical year tells the story of the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. Mystagogical catechesis is reflection on the mystery of God at work as we recall the stories from our ancestors proclaimed through the course of the liturgical year. This reflection can come through homilies, shared conversations, scripture studies, teaching, and private meditation on the word of God. It is easy to “go to Mass” and let familiar stories, words, and explanations wash over us in such a way that we remember very little as we leave. A renewed commitment to pay greater attention at Sunday’s Sacred Liturgy or to read the Sunday or weekday scriptures at home can help us to begin to integrate the understanding of these mysteries more fully into our daily lives.



13th Sunday of Ordinary Time

My friend owns a pizza shop which has been judged to be one of the best in our area. The secret is the sauce, an incredible blend of ingredients that gives the pizza a distinctive and irresistible taste. People order a week in advance because there is a limited number she can make each night. But try as I might, I can not get her to divulge the recipe, or even the secret ingredient that makes the pizza so incredibly good. I'll just have to put my order in like everyone else!

Faith has a secret ingredient that makes it special, and hard to resist. This ingredient causes believers to do great things, to be unselfish and giving, to focus on the needs of others. It causes us to want to relieve suffering, end conflicts, feed the hungry, and serve others. It gives eternal value to small acts of kindness and allows us to see and touch the face of God. The ingredient is love.

God loves us so much that he became one of us. He shares himself with us so that through him, and in him, and with him, we find life and grace. His love is the ingredient that gives all people not only dignity and value, but a destination and purpose. And the most amazing thing is that he himself is love.
