



September 4: *USCCB Collection-second collection*Established in 1887 as a graduate and research center,
The Catholic University of America is a pontifical university
located in Washington, D.C. At the Plenary Council of Baltimore
in 1866, the bishops of the United States expressed their desire to
establish a university.

Years later, with the approval of Pope Leo XIII, Catholic University was founded to provide a center of learning for clergy and laity alike. It began offering undergraduate degrees in 1904. Today, over 5,000 students attend CU, choosing from a variety of undergraduate and graduate programs. The Board of Trustees, comprised of clergy and laity, oversees the operation of CU's 193 acres, 55 major builds and a library of just under 2 million volumes. The university motto is *Deus Lux Mea Est*, God Is My Light.


