This Mass recalls for us the institution of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Holy Orders. During the Mass, the priests of our parish will wash the feet of a number of the first time members of our parish community in this Jubilee Year. The Washing of the Feet, the Mandatum, is a reminder that each of us - clergy, religious and lay people, young and old – is called to be a servant to one another. It is also a reminder to us of how special our priests are to our parish and our lives. At the end of Mass, we will process around the parish – led by some of the third graders who received the Eucharist for the first time last year – and place the Eucharist in the Father John Brendel Parish Center. All are invited to come and pray before the Blessed Sacrament until 12 Midnight when we celebrate Night Prayer.

The Easter Vigil is the most beautiful and touching Mass of our entire liturgical year. During the Vigil, we celebrate the Paschal Mystery – Jesus Christ has gone through death to new life – in a most prayerful and spirit filled way!

We are renewed because we hear God's Word, we renew our Baptismal vows, we celebrate the Easter sacraments with women and men of the RCIA, and share in the gift of the Eucharist. Come and pray with our parish family.



“Directed Retreat Week” is coming to OLL!

How does it work?

We will meet initially on Sunday afternoon at 2 PM at Our Lady of Lourdes. Our first meeting will last about one hour and you will meet your retreat director/prayer guide. The Prayer Guides are a group of spiritual directors affiliated with St. Ignatius Retreat Center, Manhasset who have been trained in leading prayers and spiritual exercises in the tradition of St. Ignatius.

After this meeting, each retreatant will meet privately with his/her prayer guide at our parish for approximately one-half hour each day, Monday through Friday. During these meetings, the retreatant and prayer guide will reflect together and will examine different ways to pray, including meditation and praying with scripture. Each retreatant commits to set aside a half hour each day for a prayer period on a scripture passage. On Saturday morning at 9:30 AM, there will be a group closing session at Our Lady of Lourdes.



Palm Sunday

On the south side of Chicago, a commuter train was approaching the downtown station. Traveling too fast, it jumped the tracks and derailed, injuring many passengers. One badly injured woman lay on the cinders beside the accident; a local politician had happened upon the scene and after speaking with the woman, retrieved her book bag from the wreckage. The politician made sure the local papers told the story of what she had done for the accident victim; nowhere in the same story were the names of the people who had carried the woman off the train or attended to her wounds.

On this Palm Sunday, our Gospel reading from Mark relates the story of three people. Most noted and remembered is Judas' betrayal of Jesus, the priests' pleasure in this news, and the promise of money for the information. But unnamed and often forgotten from this passage are two others. An unnamed woman anoints Jesus' head with expensive perfume, an act which Jesus recognizes as an acknowledgement of his impending death. The other is the man carrying the jar of water who opens his home to the disciples to prepare for the Last Supper.

It was Jesus' understanding that many of those who lined the road celebrating his final entrance into Jerusalem would soon change their shouts to "Crucify him!" The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem is to be celebrated as a manifestation of the coming of the kingdom of God. It is this celebration of Palm Sunday that the Church's liturgy solemnly opens Holy Week. (CCC 560) (c) 2006 Liturgical Publications Inc
