Assembly...YOU!

Last year at World Youth Day, Pope Benedict XVI called on young people to see the liturgy – the prayer and praise of the Church, essential to their lives. His words are challenging and a cause for reflection for all of us! Throughout the next few weeks, we'll publish those words here. Take some time each week to read them over and let them take effect in your life!

If the Church tells us that the Eucharist is an essential part of Sunday, this is no mere positivism or thirst for power. On Easter morning, first the women and then the disciples had the grace of seeing the Lord. From that moment on, they knew that the first day of the week, Sunday, would be His day, the day of Christ the Lord. The day when creation began became the day when creation was renewed. Creation and redemption belong together. That is why Sunday is so important.

It is good that today, in many cultures, Sunday is a free day, and is often combined with Saturday so as to constitute a “week-end” of free time. Yet this free time is empty if God is not present.

For reflection:

As we prepare for another “school year” how can you make Sunday a little more “free”?

How can you really make this a day for the Lord?

Feast of the Transfiguration

At one time or another, we have all thrown up our hands at a perplexing situation and proclaimed, "I just don't get it." Equally frustrating, how many times have we tried to explain or demonstrate something to someone only to be greeted with a blank stare? Still, the human spirit is one that never really gives up. Often it only takes seeing the situation from a different angle for our eyes to be opened to the solution. We see the light.

On this, the Feast of the Transfiguration, we find in the Gospel reading a Jesus who has spent most of his public ministry teaching through parables, healing, and foretelling of his own death and resurrection. He understands that up to this point he has been viewed as the human Jesus. However, a different Jesus is revealed to Peter, James and John atop the mountain in a glorious garment, the appearance of Moses and Elijah, and finally the voice of God - "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him!"

Of all the characteristics common to the mysteries of Jesus, revelation is prevalent today. We are taught that Christ's whole earthly life, from what he said and did, his prayerful manner, even his suffering and pain is the revelation of God. (CCC 516) Remember that Jesus said "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." When we do, God's revelation to Peter, James and John - and so to us - provides the clear light of truth to guide our lives.

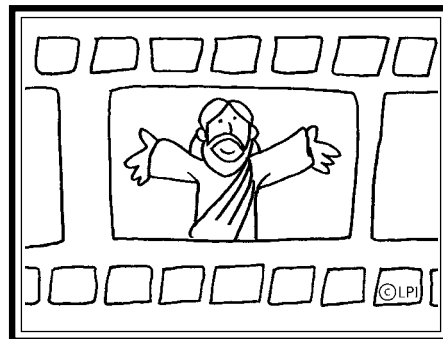

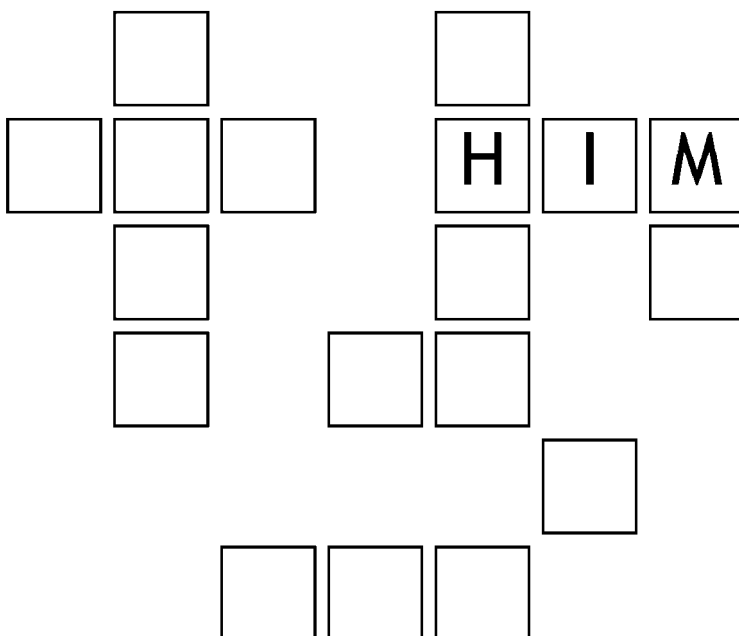

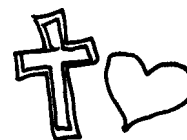
