Dear Parishioners:

I hope and trust that all goes well by you and that you had a great Thanksgiving with family and friends – and that you had a delicious time with the left-overs as well! We do have much to be thankful for and Thanksgiving is an opportunity to reflect upon all the tender mercies that God has showered upon us.

As you know, last Sunday, Deacon Jack Teufel and I celebrated our anniversaries as a priest (30 years) and as a deacon (35 years). Deacon Jack, in fact, is from the first ordination class of deacons in our Diocese of Rockville Centre. We would like to thank everyone involved in making the celebration so special, from the liturgy (choir, musicians, ushers, lectors, Eucharistic ministers) to everyone who assisted with the reception following the Mass of Thanksgiving. We want to thank everyone who made sandwiches, desserts, etc. We especially want to thank Sr. Nancy for taking leadership in getting it all together!

Today we celebrate the first Sunday of the season of **Advent**. Advent is a time of waiting; waiting for the coming of Christ at the end of time (1st two weeks of Advent) and waiting for the coming of Christ at Christmas (the last two weeks of Advent). The children will love each event and these events will help our children realize the true meaning of Christmas: the gift that God the Father gave us, the gift of his son, Jesus Christ.

The secular world likes to count down how many more "shopping" days until Christmas; as believers, you and I should count down how many more "praying" days until Christmas. As you read this letter, we have 24 more "praying" days until Christmas. Use these days wisely and draw closer to the Lord Jesus.


