Ministry Profile: Religious Education

The Church has used the word "catechesis" to describe the ministry which seeks to make faith living, conscious and active through teaching, prayer and witness. The word catechesis is derived from an ancient word meaning to echo the word of God. Parents are the primary religious educators of their children. Parents and guardians teach by the way they live and practice our Catholic Christian faith.

Religious education, as a tangible sign of *love* of God, *love* of family, *love* of parish family, creates an environment to *serve* others. It is in this selfless giving that parents serve in our Religious Education Program by volunteering as catechists, hall monitors, babysitters, chaperones, clerical assistants, hospitality, shopping, phoning, computer work, thereby engaging in sharing their passion in every way.

The Christian community recognizes that it must help parents assume their responsibility of educating their children in the faith. Those responding to this call from God are Catechists. As catechists, in particular, he or she *serves* by their desire to share their faith by teaching weekly classes, preparing, attending monthly workshops and working on special grade level activities.

The mission of the **Religious Education Ministry** at Our Lady of Lourdes is to provide the basis for a lifelong process of catechesis in the foundations of our Catholic faith, in an atmosphere of prayer, learning and service to 2,800 students. Our Directors of Religious Education, Sister Diane Liona and Sister Nancy Campkin, supported by Barbara Catuosco and Rita Spera of the Religious Education staff, provide leadership and inspiration to the 150 catechists and 200 volunteers who carry out the ministry's mission. This is accomplished through catechist workshops, parent meetings, family Eucharistic and prayer celebrations, sacramental preparation, sacramental celebrations, "hang-out" nights, and of course, religious education classes for students in grades 1 through 9... with the lived experience that the journey continues... because *When We Love, We Serve... and We Belong.*

As catechists and volunteers in the Religious Education Ministry, adults and high school students are called to share their faith with the young people of our parish. They act not only as teachers, but more importantly as models of faith, companions on their journey of faith, facilitating communication between the young people and the mystery of God, between young people and the community, and among themselves.

By virtue of our Baptismal call we respond to God's call in our life by serving our church and one another in our parish family. Consider your passion to serve God. Listen to God's invitation in your life. Do you have a desire to share your faith? Are you open to the surprising ways your own faith may be deepened through this experience of sharing your faith?

Trinity Sunday

A number of scientists were asked about the influence of science on their faith. You might expect that they would be agnostic and dismiss religion as superstition. But many had a very different reaction. The more they delved into their fields of study, the more convinced they were of the existence of God. The mysteries of the universe pointed to the source of creation.

The mystery of the Trinity is not one we can explain or fully comprehend. Our finite intelligence cannot wrap itself around that which is infinite. But we can describe it. We speak of God as creator, source life, font of love. We see Jesus as Savior, eternal priest, Lord and teacher. We see the Holy Spirit as life, love, power and sanctifier. Our descriptions allow us to understand, in part, the mystery of God as he lives and acts in our lives.

Contemplating the mystery of God can either overwhelm us or push us closer to belief. God is all that Jesus has revealed him to be. He loves us, redeems us and makes us holy. He shares himself with us. God is closer to us than we are to ourselves. The great mystery is not how God can be so great, but rather that we are so great to God.
