



God Always Offers a New Beginning

Christmas 2005

Thanksgiving Day is always special at Our Lady of Lourdes because it was on Thanksgiving in 1956 that mass was celebrated in our parish for the first time. This year, Thanksgiving not only marked our anniversary, but also the beginning of a Jubilee year as we prepare to celebrate our 50th anniversary in 2006. That day, and during the following weekend, we listened to men and women who were present at the beginning describe how they, like the pilgrims in our country, first began this parish. There were wonderful, spirited memories of mass in a department store (Korvette's), and men and women who literally prepared the land and built the place of worship we are in today.

It must have been a wonderful adventure, a time filled with energy and possibility. It sounds like a time not unlike the feast we are celebrating this weekend—the birth, the incarnation of Christ into all of time and human history. That beginning, a humble birth in a manger announced to the poorest and lowliest people of the earth, had the power to transform all of human history and still captures the hearts of believers today.

It is interesting to me how people, when they speak of good times – times of hope and possibility, often talk about the past. Less commonly do we hear people excited about the present. Even in conversations about our faith, we often talk about what happened and how God acted a long time ago. But faith is much more about the future than the past. It is about how we are moving toward God and about what God is doing in our world.

And so it seems to me that the most important prophecy of Christmas for a parish celebrating an anniversary is that *God Always Offers a New Beginning*. We need to hear it as a community so that we will know that our future will be at least as good as our beginning. We need to hear it personally to know that the present moment is the right time for our own change and conversion. And we need to know it in our world so that the message of peace is something we can really work on together.

May the strength of our past and the hope for the future bring us many blessings this Christmas and always.



Living God's Covenant with the Poor in the Parish of St. Joseph the Worker, East Patchogue: Emmanuel Made Visible

Christmas at St. Joseph the Worker is an exciting, exhausting time, as with most parish outreaches that have a Christmas program for the poor. In order to stretch our resources and eliminate duplication, we network with local agencies and schools. This has helped in many ways. We are better able to provide for our families and enjoy the Holiday giving ourselves.

Each year the volunteers create more ways to make the gift giving process, for so many families, a truly joyous, dignified process. We have created an equitable distribution of gifts that we call "Santa's Workshop." We use a classroom in the parish center to display all the gifts. Santa's "elves" arrange the gifts according to age and sex for ease of selection. Families are sent a letter telling them when to come to select the gifts for their children. Because of the generosity of the parishioners here, each parent was able to select four gifts for each child. We have Confirmation class students entertain and distract the children, if they come with their parents, so the gifts can be packed without the children seeing them. Instead of trying to collect and store turkeys (the dreaded word at Holiday time) we provide supermarket script so that the families can buy their own ethnic foods for their Holiday meal. It is truly Emmanuel made visible here at St. Joseph the Worker.

Christmas morning! For parents, much planning and preparation has taken place for this morning. Gifts have been purchased and wrapped, meals cooked, cards and letters have been sent. But most importantly, we take the time to gather our families and join each other in celebration of this blessed day with our "other" family - our pastor and the other members of our church. He is our shepherd, and we are his flock.

In the Gospel of Luke, shepherds of that day 2,000 years ago were told of a savior born in Bethlehem. The angels proclaiming this good news had told them this great joy would be for all people; their mission, it can be said, would be to ensure this good news was shared. And share it they did! with Mary, to put their names on King David's family list. While they were there, it was time for the greatest King to be born. We know who he is-Jesus, God's Son.


