Living Liturgy

Assembly...YOU!

Last year at World Youth Day, Pope Benedict XVI called on young people to see the liturgy – the prayer and praise of the Church, essential to their lives. His words are challenging and a cause for reflection for all of us! Throughout the next few weeks, we'll publish those words here. Take some time each week to read them over and let them take effect in your life!

We all eat the one bread, and this means that we ourselves become one. In this way, adoration, as we said earlier, becomes union. God no longer simply stands before us as the One who is totally Other. He is within us, and we are in Him. His dynamic enters into us and then seeks to spread outwards to others until it fills the world, so that his love can truly become the dominant measure of the world. I like to illustrate this new step urged upon us by the Last Supper by drawing out the different nuances of the word “adoration” in Greek and in Latin. The Greek word is *proskynesis*. It refers to the gesture of submission, the recognition of God as our true measure, supplying the norm that we choose to follow. It means that freedom is not simply about enjoying life in total autonomy, but rather about living by the measure of truth and goodness, so that we ourselves can become true and good. This gesture is necessary even if initially our yearning for freedom makes us inclined to resist it.

For reflection:

What is preventing you from submitting to the Lord?

What do you have to “let go” of in your life so God can be “let in”?

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time

When our children were very young, we would proudly display the artwork created by little hands on the refrigerator and other places throughout the house and at work, as most parents do. As they grew, art was replaced by spelling quizzes and math papers which in turn were replaced by diplomas and certificates. Our children were so proud of what they had done, and we wanted to do whatever we could to help them show the world their accomplishments.

Today's Gospel reading is a particularly happy occasion for Jesus, although the reading itself makes no mention of his mood. After having sent the disciples out in pairs to spread the Good News, he now welcomes them back and listens to tales of their travels. Imagine him laughing, telling them to go and rest in a secluded place. But imagine his even greater joy as those very people that the disciples had spoken to now followed them to Jesus!

Jesus could be likened to a pleased parent, listening to his children tell him about all the good they had done. For in drawing others to Jesus, he knows his disciples have worked to fulfill a human desire that is of divine origin - happiness. God placed this desire in our hearts in order to draw us to the One who alone can give it. (CCC 1718) As those who listened to the disciples and felt drawn to Jesus, so we are drawn to God.

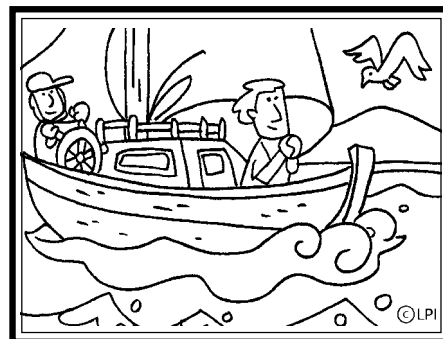
