Dear Parishioners:

As you know, the issue of abortion has been a central topic in the news. While I am not a lawyer, and while the legal reasoning is very nuanced, I would propose the following: In 1973, the Supreme Court ruled that the U.S. Constitution provides a "fundamental right to privacy that protects a person's right to choose whether to have an abortion". In the latest Supreme Court case, the majority of the Justices concluded that the Constitution does NOT explicitly state that a person has a constitutional right to privacy. Since that right is not explicitly in the Constitution, the authority to regulate abortion returns to the individual states. The Tenth Amendment makes explicit the idea that the powers of the federal government are limited to only those powers granted in the Constitution. Otherwise, such issues must be taken care of with legislation at the state level.

So, the focus is now on each individual state. Sadly, New York State is one of the most – if not the most – pro-abortion state in the country. Women can have an abortion up to the moment of birth! A third trimester abortion – a partial birth abortion- is particularly heinous. Normally, a baby is born head-first. In a partial birth abortion, the abortionist manipulates the baby in the womb, so that the baby is born feet first. While the infant's head is still in the birth canal, the abortionist takes a knife and plunges the knife into the head of the baby, thus killing the baby. This is legal in NY State! Even Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan, a former Democratic Senator for New York and a proponent of abortion, believed this was infanticide – and he was right!

World-wide, there are only 6 other countries that have such liberal abortion laws: China, North Korea, Vietnam, Canada, Netherlands, and Singapore. I would say that you never want to be on any list that also includes China, North Korea and Vietnam!

So, for us in New York, we need to instill a greater respect for human life, from conception to natural death. Firstly, we need to intentionally pray for this increased respect for human life. Secondly, everyone should know that the Catholic Church has been and will continue to help women who are pregnant and in need to support: health, financial and spiritual. Catholic Charities Regina Residence in Merrick is just one example of the outreach of the Catholic Church. This residence cares for women (ages 11-25) with a whole variety of supportive services. Resources are available; we need to let people know about these great resources for women in need.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.


Baby Blanket Bunch - Volunteer Opportunities


Long Island Women's Retreat Ministry - "Remain in Me" Retreat


