A Note from Fr. Charles

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This past Friday we celebrated the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Saturday we celebrated the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These two hearts are filled with deep love for each one of us. Jesus says in John's gospel, chapter 15 verse 9, "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love.... I have told you this so that my joy might be in you and your joy might be complete....". In the 1981 apparitions of the mother of

Jesus in Medjugorje, Bosnia-Hercegovina, Mary said to the children (and to us today), "If you knew how much I loved you, you would weep for joy". In the Old Testament book Zephaniah 3:17 the Lord speaks to us through the prophet: "Fear not....be not discouraged. The Lord, your God, is in your midst, a mighty Savior; He will rejoice over you with gladness, and renew you in His love. He will sing joyfully because of you, as one sings at festivals." In Isaiah 43:1-5 it says: "But now, thus says the Lord, who created you...and formed you...fear not, for I have redeemed you. I have called you and you are mine....For I am the Lord your God....you are precious in my eyes and glorious and I love you." St. Catherine of Sienna (1347-1380), a theological doctor and mystic of the Catholic Church says that due to her mystical encounters of God she has come to learn that God does not just love us, he is mad with love for us. In other words, he is madly in love with us. This is a very powerful statement.

Over the past 31 years of my priesthood, I have found that people struggle with receiving this intense love of God and our Lady for them. They struggle in receiving the truth that God sings because of them, rejoices over them, loves them with such a deep tenderness as stated in everything quoted above. Why? In some cases, it is because their human experience of love is so broken and fractured that they ask, how can I trust God's love? Is His love for me real? Dependable? Firm as a rock? Consistent? You mean to tell me; God won't get tired of me? God won't betray me, reject me or abandon me at some point? The answer to all of these questions is NO. Some people struggle in accepting and opening up to this intense love in their life because of one's past sinfulness. As a result, they find it hard to believe that God sees them as lovable. Sometimes people find it hard to believe that God loves them so tenderly because of the suffering they have endured. They blame God. God has not dealt them suffering like someone dealing out a deck of cards. Suffering happens in all our lives but our good God promises to give us what we need to walk through it with faith and courage. God can indeed be glorified in our suffering and our suffering can be redemptive for others when we offer it to the Father with Jesus. St. John Vianney (1786-1859) said, *"Suffering not offered up is wasted suffering"*.

So how can we bask in, marinate in and savor the unfathomable, intense love that the Lord has for us? By letting Him love us. By saying YES to His love for us today. I would encourage you to pray for the following grace each day. "Lord, please grant me the grace to be filled with the fullness of your love for me." He has been answering this in my life, I know He will do it in yours as well. I would also encourage you to slowly read one of the scripture passages I mentioned above and then reread it a second time slowly and then close the bible, close your eyes and take a few minutes to sit with the word of God. Let what you just read fill your heart, mind and soul. God's word is living and active. The Lord is the same yesterday, today and forever. The way the Lord loved and forgave the apostles for their sinfulness; He will forgive you too. If Jesus can forgive Peter for betraying Him thru his denial of knowing Jesus, then Jesus can also forgive you your sins. Maybe to help you open up to the Lord's love for you, reading a scripture passage about the Lord's forgiveness will help. Feel free to read the prodigal son story in Luke 15:11-32 or the woman who washes the feet of Jesus with her tears and dries them with her hair -- Luke 7:36-49. After reading the scripture be aware of what you are feeling. Is it joy or maybe doubt that He can forgive you? Whatever it is you are feeling (the good, the bad and the ugly), tell the Lord in prayer. Be heart to heart with Him. Then sit in silence with Him for a few moments. Give the Lord the chance to love you like never before. Give Him the chance to communicate His presence to you. Why? Because being loved my Him is the source of our real Joy. Jesus mentions that in the scripture I quoted above - John 15:9.

As the scripture says, recall the good deeds of the Lord *(in your life)*. Remember the mercy He has shown you. Perhaps going to confession could be the very thing you need to help open the door of your heart to His love (and Our Lady's love) for you. When we open our hearts to the love of God and that of the Blessed Mother, their love in us automatically overflows to others. Other people will see the love of God and our Lady in us. They will see the joy in us even in the midst of our suffering. Our joy is that we are love by God and that He is with us, we are never alone. Like a lover filled with joy over the fact that he or she is loved and now shares life with the one who is in love with them. So too us with God.

Remember, with God you can do the unthinkable, the unimaginable and even forgive what you think is unforgivable.




