Dear Parishioners:

Happy Father's Day! May God bless and guide our fathers and may God the Father reward all our dads for all their sacrificial love for their children. The first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910 in the state of Washington. However, it was not until 1952 that the day became a national holiday (58 years after President Woodrow Wilson make Mother's Day a national holiday).

Some Father's Day "fun facts":

- There are more than 70 million dads in the USA, with about 1/3 with kids under 18.
- Father's Day is the 4th biggest day for greeting cards (after Christmas, Valentine's Day and Mother's Day).
- Father's Day is celebrated in other countries as well. In Europe, since the Middle Ages, Father's Day was connected with St. Joseph's Day since St. Joseph was the foster father of Jesus. Now, however, many European countries have also placed the celebration on the third Sunday of June.
- In Germany, on Father's Day, men drink all day at beer gardens.
- In Thailand, Father's Day is celebrated in December, and everyone wears yellow.
- Fathers are given bright yellow canna flowers (similar to a lily).
- In Nepal, there is a ceremony in which sons touch their heads to their father's feet and daughters touch their heads to their father's hands.

Pope Francis has made some comments about fathers:

Fatherhood is giving life to others.

Like St. Joseph, you, too, must be guardians in age, wisdom, and grace.

Nothing could better express the pride and emotion that a father feels when he understands that he has handed down to his child what really matters in life, that is, a wise heart.

- Being a father is not easy since it requires a lot of grace and patience.
- Fathers are so necessary as examples and guides for our children in wisdom and virtue.
- Without father figures, young people often feel orphaned; left adrift at a critical moment in their growth and development. "A society without fathers is a society of orphans.
- I ask that you have the grace to be very close to your children, letting them grow but being by their side. They need you, your presence, to be there, your love.

A father is present; he is close to his wife and children.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.






The Year of St Joseph
