Dear Parishioners:

As you may know, every few years the Church holds a Synod. Synods date back to the time of the Apostles (see Acts 6:3). Synods are meetings held on a diocesan, regional and universal level for the purpose "to discern, by the light of the Word of God and listening to the Holy Spirit, the doctrinal, liturgical, canonical and pastoral questions that arise as time goes by."

Thus, a Synod is a religious meeting or assembly at which bishops, gathered around and with the Holy Father, have opportunity to interact with each other and to share information and experiences, in the common pursuit of pastoral solutions which have a universal validity and application.

After Vatican II, Pope Paul VI established the Synod of Bishops, an advisory board to the Holy Father. Since then, the bishops meet in synods (assemblies) and make recommendations to the pope. Since 1967, there have been 16 ordinary synods, 3 extraordinary synods, and 11 special synods. Synods tend to focus on a specific topic. In very recent times, Pope Francis has held a Synod on the family (2014) and youth (2018).

The two Greek roots of the word "synod" mean "walking together on a path." In 2015, at a ceremony for the anniversary of the establishment of the Synod of Bishops, , Pope Francis gave a speech that laid out his views on "synodality". The word "synod," he reminded the audience, is about cooperation:

"A synodal Church is a Church which listens," he said, pointing out that mutual listening has been the goal of much of the church's renewal since Vatican II. For the disciples of Jesus, yesterday, today and always, the only authority is the authority of service, the only power is the power of the cross."

Since then, Francis has taken steps to give the church examples and a concrete framework for a more "synodal church." In 2018, he issued new regulations that encourage much wider consultation with members and organizations of the church at all levels as part of the synod process.

Please see the next page outlining the questions that are pertinent to the synod. These questions will guide our discussion. After our two listening sessions, I must compile a 2-page report which I will submit to Bishop Barres. As you can imagine, since this is a world-wide effort, we have to be brief in our responses! Please join us in the Parish Center on either Tuesday, May 24 at 7:00pm OR Wednesday, May 25 at 9:30am.

Synod Consultation

Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about what is happening in local parishes. He and the bishops of the world would like to know what individuals think we should all be doing to help make our parishes better. The way he has proposed doing this is a synodal process. Synod means "journeying together" and it involves listening to the Holy Spirit and to each other in order to discern the path we are called to walk together.

The synod "is intended to inspire people to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make people's hopes flourish, to stimulate trust, to bind up wounds, to weave new and deeper relationships, to learn from one another, to build bridges, to enlighten minds, warm hearts, and restore strength to our hands for our common mission."

To that end, I invite you to participate in the world-wide synodal process by joining us for a parish-session on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>May 24 at 7:00pm OR Wednesday</u>, <u>May 25 at 9:30am in the PARISH CENTER</u>. I ask you to prayerfully consider your responses to four major categories of discussion to be submitted to Rome for their consideration. Please bring your <u>briefly</u> written responses to either session for discussion which will be included in our report to the Vatican:

1. Journeying Together

- a. How is journeying together happening in your life as the "church-in-the-world"?
- b. What is your role in this journey as a member of the parish and involvement in ministry and apostolic work?
- c. What are examples and personal experiences of journeying together in your parish as you devote yourself to an apostolate?
 - d. What are the joys and sorrows of this journey?
 - e. What obstacles do you experience in this journey?
 - f. What assists you in this journey?

Communion

- a. What makes communities of faith strong? What makes them weak?
- b. What inspires you as you witness the experiences within your community?
- c. What are the joys of parish life?
- d. What are possible ways to reach out to those who feel alienated?
- e. What are some initiatives you could consider in reaching out to other faith communities?

3. Participation

- a. What are some significant reasons for the lack of participation by members of the community?
- b. What makes you want to participate in the journey of the community?

4. Mission

- a. What are your hopes for the Universal Church?
- b. What is helpful in planning these ideas and executing them?





