I'd like to start with a sincere THANK YOU for the overwhelming and humbling generosity that you have shown on the occasion of my Silver Jubilee. The cards, gifts and presents were staggering (also makes me worry a little about how much coffee you think I actually drink). I am making an attempt to send Thank You notes, but I do not want to leave anyone out, as I do not have return addresses for some. What was most touching, though, were your words of gratitude for my service, and pointing out the parts of my Ministry that have affected you. Thank you all so much.

Perhaps it is not a big stretch to reflect a bit on gratitude. When we were children, we were taught to say "Thank you" (to send cards), a very good lesson, but also merely a learned response. It takes time for us to actually feel grateful. Gratitude is a response that we choose to have. As we grow, we begin to realize that giving thanks, having gratitude, actually affects us. Gratitude is what wells up out of us when we truly accept what is. Gratitude is where we stand when we realize that everything is a gift.

Gratitude is the result of being other-centered and not self-centered. One cannot be grateful and resentful at the same time, or grateful and angry, or grateful and afraid. Gratitude is what happens when we are content with who we are and where we are at. Gratitude can actually make us happier and healthier. Gratitude is even the best disposition we can have towards God. The medieval mystic Meister Eckhart said, "If the only prayer you say in your life is Thank You, that would suffice."

As we approach the summer, what is it that you are grateful for? Gratitude is an attitude that can be cultivated. Gratitude can be practiced, the more we focus on what we have (what is) and are grateful for it, the less we will focus on what we don't have (what "should" be). Perhaps start a list of everything you are grateful for. Each day for the entire summer, when you get up in the morning, write down one thing that you are grateful for. Use a specific piece of paper or even better still, a notebook or journal, perhaps put it on your night table. The only rule is that you cannot write the same thing again, each day you write only one thing you are grateful for. Try to make it to Labor Day and see what happens.

- * *Gratitude is independent of one's objective life circumstances;*
- * *Gratitude is a function of attention;*
- * *Entitlement makes gratitude impossible;*
- * *When we continue to receive something on a regular basis, we typically begin to take it for granted;*
- * *Our deepest sense of gratitude comes through grace - the awareness that we have not earned, nor do we deserve what we have been given;*
- * *Gratitude can be cultivated through sincere self-reflection; and*
- * *The expression of gratitude (through words and deeds) has the effect of heightening our personal experience of gratitude.*

A Statement from Timothy Cardinal Dolan and the Bishops of New York State

Calling on Governor Cuomo and Leaders in Albany: Don't Let Us Down

More than 200 Catholic schools have closed in the last 15 years throughout New York State, as families and parishes, who strongly believe in the value of Catholic education, struggle to keep up with increasing costs. Many of our public schools also desperately need help.

To address these needs, the NYS Catholic Bishops joined a broad coalition of faith groups, community organizations and labor unions backing legislation called the **Education Investment Tax Credit**. The measure would encourage increased charitable donations to generate more private scholarships as well as additional resources to public schools. It also helps all teachers provide needed materials and supplies for every classroom in New York.

The vast majority of legislators support the bill. Why? It's because the legislation will help all children, regardless of where they go to school. It's a win-win for all families!

Although Governor Cuomo assured us he would fight to include the proposal in the state budget, in the end, we were left out.

As the legislative session ends in Albany this coming week, we pray that Governor Cuomo won't let us down. We ask that you join us in that prayer. Pray that Governor Cuomo will put children ahead of politics and fight for the Education Investment Tax Credit.







America's First Freedom: Religious Liberty

And so – will we allow America's Freedom of Religion to end...not with a bang, but with a whimper? Our freedom of religion is being regulated into a mere freedom to worship, which confines faith and worship, religious morals and principles within the four walls of the church, well out of public discourse and the public square.

Our first amendment Religious Liberty has been breached; but not with blood in the streets, troops tearing religious symbols from churches and citizens murdered for their faith as was done most recently in Egypt and Syria. This unprecedented, unconstitutional denial of the right of Americans to practice their conscience in their community came with the Aug 1st, 2012, imposition of the new healthcare law's Health and Human Services mandate which imposes secular ideology over the religious-based conscience rights of all Americans.

As of that date, all private employers were required to bend to the HHS mandate to provide or facilitate contraception, sterilization and abortion-inducing drugs as part of their employees' insurance. The religious beliefs of those employers are grievously denied in a way not imagined in the 222 years our 1st amendment has protected Freedom of Religion.

Many Catholic institutions are also subject to the mandate because they are not deemed to be "religious enough" to be exempted. Will the Little Sisters of the Poor be forced out of their ministry to the elderly poor? Will our Catholic schools, hospitals and charities close their doors to avoid violating the consciences of all Catholics involved or be bankrupted out of existence by crushing fines?

The Fortnight For Freedom, June 21 to July 4, reminds us to pray for the preservation of religious liberty and offers opportunities to learn the issues involved. It comes to us, in this place and time, to inform ourselves and make it clear to those who would tell us how much of our religious beliefs we may follow, that we will not surrender our freedom.

As Bishop Murphy has said, *"We will not compromise our faith. We will not accept rules and regulations that violate our consciences or impose actions and practices that go against the moral teachings of our faith and our Church. We will not bend our knees to the false gods of secularism. We will not allow Caesar to re-define our faith or banish us, our Church or other religious faiths, from the public square to the shadows of our cities or the walled gardens of our inner selves. AND WE WILL NOT GIVE UP OR GIVE IN!"*
