

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. Pope Pius XI instituted The Feast of Christ the King in 1925 for the universal church in his encyclical *Quas Primas*. He connected the increasing denial of Christ the King to the rise of secularism. At the time of *Quas Primas*, many Christians (including Catholics) began to doubt Christ's authority and existence, as well as the Church's power to continue Christ's authority. Pius XI, and the rest of the Christian world, witnessed the rise of non-Christian dictatorships in Europe, and saw Catholics being taken in by these earthly leaders. These dictators often attempted to assert authority over the Church. Just as the Feast of Corpus Christi was instituted when devotion to the Eucharist was at a low point, the Feast of Christ the King was instituted during a time when respect for Christ and the Church was waning, when the feast was needed most.

Pope Pius XI hoped the institution of the feast would have various effects. They were: 1) That nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, and immunity from the state (Quas Primas, 32). 2) That leaders and nations would see that they are bound to give respect to Christ (Quas Primas, 31). 3) That the faithful would gain strength and courage from the celebration of the feast, as we are reminded that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills and bodies.

Today, for some, the only authority is the individual self. Also, many balk at the idea of kings and queens, believing them to be antiquated. However, these individuals miss the point: Christ's kingship is one of **Humility** and **Service**.

This weekend marks the last Sunday of the Church year. Next Sunday, we begin the new Church year with the season of Advent. This week, you will receive in the mail a flyer detailing the various **Advent Opportunities**. I urge you to take advantage of these opportunities to grow spiritually during the Advent season. I know that December is a busy time but all the more reason to take some time out to prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.

Now and at the Hour of Our Death Catholic Guidance for End of Life Decision Making

Talking about death and dying can be difficult and uncomfortable, yet perhaps no conversations are more profound or necessary for all of us. End-of-life decisions are among the most challenging we will ever face as individuals and families and as members of society. Residents of New York State must be particularly vigilant as we seek to oppose any legisla-

tion that promotes assisted suicide.

Our lives are not our own ... "The Church teaches us that each and every human life is an unrepeatable gift, created in the image and likeness of God. We are called to respect and protect human life because of its inherent dignity, sacredness and value. We understand that life is a sacred trust over which we have been given stewardship, but not ownership. Our life belongs to God, and we do not have absolute power over it. So while it is entrusted to us, we are called to care for it, preserve it and use it for the glory of God. All those who are sick should rightfully expect, accept, and be provided appropriate food, water, pain control, bed rest, suitable room temperature, personal hygiene measures and comfort care. These are not medical treatments, but basic care-giving, the care that is owed to one human being by another. Truly to respect the dignity of the person, we must provide those who are sick with adequate pain relief, symptom management, compassion, acceptance, love, and physical, emotional and spiritual care."



Sharing the Gospel


