### Is it Time to Vote Yet?

Every year it seems that Christmas decorations are put out earlier and earlier by retailers. If I recall correctly, I saw the first artificial Christmas trees being displayed in August! The same holds true for our Presidential elections. Seems like the whole process started about two years ago! It is no wonder that we are so stressed out. We have forgotten how to live in the moment. Having said this, we as individuals have a choice. We can either get caught up in this frenzied pace or choose another way. This year's election will be held on Tuesday November 3<sup>rd</sup>, only about three weeks away. Of course, with various ways to vote, including early voting, mail in, or absentee ballots, there are large numbers of people in different states that have already voted. In fact, in early October, more than two million people already cast their ballots for the next President. In any case, it is the right, obligation and privilege of every citizen to vote. Pope Francis in the Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium stated,

"An authentic faith...always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better than we found it. We love this magnificent planet on which God has put us, and we love the human family, which dwells here, with all its tragedies and struggles, its hopes and aspirations, its strengths and weaknesses. The earth is our common home and all of us are brothers and sisters. If indeed "the just ordering of society and of the state is a central responsibility of politics", the Church "cannot and must not remain on the sidelines in the fight for justice".

In fact, as Americans and Catholics, the U.S. Catholic Bishops suggest and remind us that it is our right and duty to vote. Yet, in the 2016 presidential election, only 58% of all eligible voters cast a ballot. One must wonder why we as a nation are so apathetic, especially since there are so many incredibly important issues before us such as the dignity of every human being from conception to natural death, racism, climate change, immigration, healthcare, international concerns, religious freedom, unemployment, COVID 19, poverty, a widening gap between the very wealthy and the rest of the population, and the future of social security, just to name a few! Do people not vote because they don't care or is it that they don't think their vote will matter? I would propose another reason which is that people are confused about who to vote for. How many of us agree with the position of one candidate (and their political party) but despise other positions that they have taken.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) published a voting guide called "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship". This can be found by going on the USCCB website (www.usccb.org). This guide helps the reader become aware of the many important issues before us that we need to consider when deciding on a candidate. We are advised that it is our responsibility to consider all of the issues and consider the principles of Catholic social doctrine. The issues basically fall into four basic principles which include: the dignity of the human person, the common good, subsidiarity and global solidarity. As the guide states, "with this foundation, Catholics are better able to evaluate policy positions, party platforms, and candidate's promises and actions in light of the Gospel and the moral and social teaching of the Church in order to build a better world. The Catholic Church will not tell a person how to vote. Instead, we are encouraged to prayerfully form our conscience in accordance with God's truth and prioritize the issues. There are cases, as this guide points out, when a voter "decides to take the extraordinary step of not voting for any candidate". This is when all candidates hold a position that promotes an intrinsically evil act. With this being said, it is essential for Catholics "to be guided by a well-formed conscience that recognizes that all issues do not carry the same moral weight and that the moral obligation to oppose policies promoting intrinsically evil acts has a special claim on our consciences and our actions". This guide will help in that regard. I happen to believe that, on our own, it may be very difficult to make the choice that is right for you. Hopefully with the help of God through prayer and with this guide in examining your informed conscience, one will find peace in voting for not the perfect candidate but the right one for themselves. Yes, in your small yet powerful way, you can change the world.


# **Mission Appeal - October 24-25**

From our beginnings in San Rafael, Argentina in 1988 we have grown to over 1200 sisters missioning in almost 40 different countries throughout the world. This appeal allows us to inform the members of your parish about our mission work in Papua, New Guinea. As you may imagine, our missions in places like Papua, New Guinea are in great need of support. McNamara, for giving us this opportunity to speak at Our Lady of Lourdes and share with you about our mission in Papua. As we daily strive to help those in need, we are most grateful to all of you for your prayers, contributions and generosity, truly a grace from God and a consolation for our missionary. 
