The Afterlife: Are You Ready?

Throughout my life, I have had to answer the question "are you ready" many times. When I was a young Boy Scout, the motto was Be Prepared. During my years in school, I was often asked if I was ready for my exams. As my wife and I prepared for the Sacrament of Marriage, the priest asked us if we were ready. When I joined the Coast Guard Reserves, the Coast Guard's motto is Semper Paratus, Always Ready. I am sure many of you have had the same question as to whether you were ready.

Our Gospel today from Matthew also speaks to being ready, ready for the end times. Jesus tells His disciples the parable of The Ten Bridesmaids. To understand the parable, one needs to understand the marriage customs of the time, why the groom might be delayed, and what role the bridesmaids played. Marriages were arranged and negotiated by brokers who represented both families. In modern terms, it could be compared to a corporate merger. The bride and groom would not meet until the day of the wedding. The negotiations could break down, especially over the dowry. The wedding and wedding party could easily be delayed.

Often, the bride and groom would be from different towns or villages. This meant the groom might have to travel a distance, at a time when roads were poor, there were no maps, and the method of transportation was primitive. In addition, the whole family would join the groom. It could often end up being the entire village traveling to the wedding. With all those people in transit, you can imagine the slow pace of travel.

Bridesmaids, for their part, served both a ceremonial and practical purpose. The bridesmaids would add elegance to the ceremony, but would also go to the village gate to welcome the groom. They would act as guides to the wedding. The need for oil lamps was quite evident, with poor road conditions, sanitation concerns (animal droppings) and the wedding party dressed in their finery, it was essential that the path be well-lit.

In the parable, the five bridesmaids ran out of oil, and therefore were denied entry into the wedding. This relates to our own situation, our mortality. We do not know when our time on earth will run out, but we have to be spiritually prepared to meet our maker. Fr. Joseph Krempa, in his book *Captured Fire*, compares the bridesmaid's oil to the oil of faith and grace. If we are not vigilant, our spiritual oil will diminish. Each time we participate in a sacrament, we receive grace. Do we honor our commitment to attend Mass weekly, either virtually or in person? When we pray, do we place ourselves in the presence of the Lord or do we say our prayers through rote memorization? At our Baptism, we received grace. Our parents promised to bring us up in the Faith. As time went on, our Faith Life became our responsibility to grow ever further in grace. Every time we receive Communion, we received grace. At the time of our Confirmation, we were filled with the Holy Spirit and again we received grace. For those of you who are married or received Holy Orders, once again you received grace.

In our modern society, it is easy to become distracted. It does not lessen our responsibility to God for our spiritual well-being. He has given us His Son, who died for us so that we might have eternal life. November is a time for us to take note of our own mortality. On All Saints Day and All Souls Day we are reminded that Heaven is our true home and we should be proactive in striving to get there. Like the Bridesmaids, who could not borrow oil, we cannot borrow someone else's faith. We must build upon our faith and pray that our reward will be great in Heaven.
