How Are We to Love?

For these past seven weeks, the readings have been nothing short of a love story. The story of how God the Father sent His Son into this world out of love to save us. How Jesus, obedient to the Father and out of love for us, suffered, died and rose from the dead so that we could have a share in His eternal life. Today as we celebrate Pentecost, we see a continuation of the love story. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, so that God's love would continue to remain with us and to work through us.

Of course, this is not the first time we have heard that the very essence of Christianity is love. In response to the question about the first commandments, Jesus says: The first is, Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this, you shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these."

I suppose the most challenging command that Jesus gives is that we are to love like Him! In other words, to continue His work through us. In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read that Jesus makes charity the new commandment. "The Lord asks us to love as He does, even our enemies".

So, if we are commanded to love "as Jesus loves", we must ask ourselves how did Jesus love? In the New Testament, we see frequent references to "Agape" love particularly in the writings of Paul and John. Agape love is essentially a way to describe the love that God has for us which is unconditional and selfless. This is the highest form of love, one that is intimately connected to charity. It is how God loves us and how we are supposed to return this love to God by loving one another. It is a unifying love that emanates from God, is given to us through Jesus and the Holy Spirit and returned to God by us in gratitude. The love that is returned completes the circle. As Saint Mother Teresa says, "God's thirst to love us is reflected in our thirst for God and is accomplished by loving one another."

If we are to authentically love as Jesus loved, we cannot do it alone. It is through the help of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate, that we receive the courage and fortitude to persevere. In our country, we have seen over the last several years a major division among people. It seems to me that we must start paying more attention to the objective truth and less to politics and lies that are grounded in power and greed. As an example, close to half the wealth in this country (44%) is controlled by less than 1% of the population (Pew Research) and the wealthiest 10% control 75% of household net worth (USA article). On a global basis, the United Nations reports that 26 of the world's richest people held as much wealth as half of the global population. This inequality does not unite but rather divides a nation and the world. It is also counter to the Gospel message.

We must, as a nation, respect all people based on their God given dignity, no matter their race, religion or age (from conception to natural death). Authentic love is more than a feeling or emotion just as Pentecost is not an abstract mystery. As Fr. Ron Rolheiser reminds us, once we accept and embrace the Holy Spirit in our own lives, "the Advocate starts to work in us and through us, to help us do things that we can't do all by ourselves, namely create community with each other and bring justice, peace, and joy to our world". The question is simple. Are we up for the challenge? Or maybe we should ask ourselves, do we choose to follow the command?

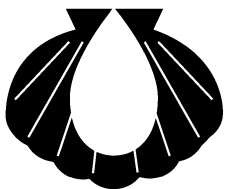

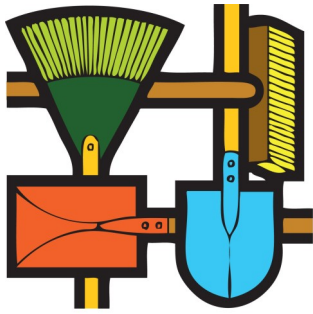

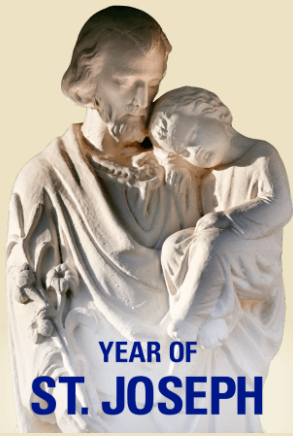

In the 129 years since its founding, the Knights of Columbus has grown into a worldwide Catholic men's organization with nearly 16,000 councils and two million members.

Most councils are parish based, like our Council, but some gather at their own halls for meetings and events. In addition to community based councils, the Knights sponsor councils on college campuses and at military bases.

Over the past decade, our members have enabled the Knights of Columbus to make charitable contributions of more than \$1.5 billion, and have donated 690 million volunteer hours to charity! But our good works do not end there. We were also founded to provide financial security to our members and their families through our highly rated life insurance and annuity programs.

As a member of our Council you will strengthen your faith and become a better Catholic man. Through your support of our parish and community you will form friendships with fellow Knights that can last a lifetime.

We meet on the second Monday of the month at 8:00pm in the All Purpose Room while observing all Covid-19 guidelines. We invite all men 18 years and older as a brother in the spirit of Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism, the four guiding principles of our order.

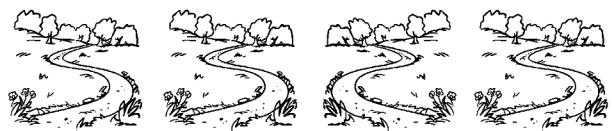

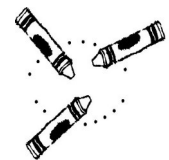
