The estimated weekly collection needed to maintain and operate our parish buildings, ministries, programs and salaries is \$17,800.

Dear Parishioners:

As you know, there have been some significant changes in the COVID-19 safety protocols. The Diocese has provided some guidance for parishes as we enter this new phase.

MASKS

Vaccinated people are <u>NOT</u> required to wear masks. However, if you are not yet vaccinated, you must continue to wear a mask while indoors in Church. As a parish family, we are NOT checking vaccination cards. I leave it to your own honesty to wear a mask inside the Church if you have not been vaccinated.

As a precaution, the priests, deacons & Eucharistic Ministers will continue to wear masks while distributing Holy Communion for the time being.

SEATING

While the Diocese has granted permission to no longer sit every other row, I have decided to maintain the "every other row" seating for the near future. With the All-Purpose room, we have enough seats to seat people every other row and I would like to maintain that for a little longer. I am hoping that by September, we can even sit normally!

MASS OBLIGATION

Since March of last year (2020), Bishop Barres, with all the bishops of the country, gave a general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and the Holy Days of Obligation. However, this dispensation will end on the weekend of August 14/15. As of that weekend, all Catholics are once again bound to attend Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

OFFERTORY PROCESSION/SIGN OF PEACE

During Mass, there will be no Offertory Procession or Sign of Peace for the near future. Certainly, you can exchange a sign of peace within your own family members.

PARISH GROUPS/MEETINGS

Parish groups, meetings and activities can resume. Groups need to follow the same protocols as inside the church: Wear a mask if not vaccinated, maintain a reasonable social distancing. Please contact Patti at the front office to make sure rooms are available, etc.

It has been a difficult time for so many of us and I am thankful that we are reaching a certain sense of normalcy.



The Year of St Joseph





Sharing the Gospel



They ate flat bread, just as the Israelites did the night they left Egypt. They drank wine, remembering the lamb's blood that saved the Israelites from the Angel of Death. Jesus ate the Passover meal with His disciples. As they ate, Jesus taught His disciples that, under God's new agreement, His own body and blood would save them.



Mission for the Week

Sometimes Jesus is referred to as the Lamb of God, or the Lamb sacrificed for our sins. Talk about how Jesus took our sins away when He died on the cross.
