I simply ask that you do NOT take a vacation form the Lord. Don't forget to go to Mass over the summer, even if you are in an unfamiliar place. God's grace does not take a vacation from us; let's not take a vacation from Him! As I noted a few weeks ago, on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), reception of the Eucharist is essential to drawing closer to Christ. Holiness is a life-long project and takes a spiritual discipline. It is not easy BUT it is possible for everyone!




