The estimated weekly collection needed to maintain and operate our parish buildings, ministries, programs and salaries is \$17,800.

Dear Parishioners:

Next Sunday, Fr. Eric Kasongo, a priest from the Diocese of Kikwit in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, will be speaking at all the Masses. As you may recall, each year our Parish assists in the work of a Missionary Congregation or Missionary Diocese. Fr. Kasongo has **two priorities** regarding this missionary appeal:

Means of transportation for priests:

Our parishes are for the most part rural parishes with the Catholic mission at the center and 45 to 100 villages around. There are 2 or 3 priests assigned to the parish; and throughout the year they must go from village to village to celebrate the Eucharist and other Sacraments and monitor various social projects. Those priests lack any means of transportation and must walk to villages sometimes from 30 to 45 miles.

With your help, we can help our missionary priests to buy some 4X4 vehicles or motorcycles. A 4x4 SUV costs \$20,000 to \$35,000 and motorcycle costs about \$5,000. The local parishes really need those kinds of means of transportation because they resist the rough conditions of the unpaved roads, often washed away during a rainy season (The Congo has 8 months of rain throughout the year!).

Education: providing poor students from elementary and high schools with tuition and supplies: As we all know, education is a passport to a brighter future. Education transforms lives, breaks the cycle of poverty, and provides a pathway to a better future. Unfortunately, education is not free at any level. In a country where more than 87% of the population lives on less than a dollar a day, parents cannot afford to send their children to school; nor can parents construct appropriate school facilities. It costs about \$150 a year to send a child to an elementary school, and \$200 to a high school. Costs for an appropriate school facility of 6 classrooms costs \$18,500.

The Diocese of Kikwit is working to provide learning opportunities that begin in early childhood and to provide every child with the knowledge and skills needed to thrive. Please help us give a chance to so many children who want to be educated and change their lives. Your gift today will make a big difference in the difference in the work of God within the Diocese of Kikwit. Please, be generous as much as you can.

Dear Parishioners:

This weekend we are publishing the annual Financial Report of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish. In addition, there is a Statement of our Parish Ministries which reflects our sacramental and ministerial activity over the past year. Our Parish Fiscal year goes from September 1, 2020 – August 31, 2021. I recently met with the Parish Finance Council to go over and discuss these figures. The Financial Statement reflects broad categories. If you have more specific questions, please feel free to contact me. We can meet and I will answer any more specific questions you might have.

I wish I could simply talk about all the wonderful spiritual and ministerial programs of our parish and all the great things that have happened in the parish over the past year, even in the midst of the pandemic. However, we are able to accomplish these things precisely because of the financial component. I am very aware of the common complaint that "the Church is always talking about money". But we always need to talk about money in terms of <u>mission</u>. The only reason for fund-raising, etc. is to further the <u>mission</u> of our Parish. Unfortunately, we can't be a community of welcome unless we have the finances to do so. Money pays the utilities, the salaries/benefits of our employees, the maintenance of our parish buildings, etc.

Overall, the Parish is in decent shape and we ended the year "in the black". On the "expense side" of the ledger, we have kept expenses in check. However, we have had some "extraordinary" expenses (boilers, as all our buildings are over 60 years old) that needed to be done. Looking ahead for this current year, I hope to repave the parking lots.

On the **"income side"** of the ledger, collections have increased from last year BUT that was the year that the COVID-19 shut down the Churches, etc.; as a result, income fell greatly. In addition, as you may recall, the COVID-19 pandemic led to cancelling our Feast in September 2020, so that was a significant loss of revenue. We also we down about \$100,000 in our Auxiliary Revenue. This was because in the 2019-2020 Fiscal year, we received some monies from the Payroll Protection Plan. That was not available in the 2020-2021 Fiscal Year. On the positive side, rental from the *HEADSTART* program has greatly helped our "bottom line".

As you may recall, in the Fall of 2019, we engaged in an Increased Offertory Stewardship Campaign. We were doing well and then the pandemic struck. If you are able, I ask that you continue your financial support for our Parish Family. Compared to the year before the pandemic year (2019-2020), we are lower in collections.

Perhaps our families are more financially stressed and have cut back on their donations to the parish. Perhaps fewer people are attending Mass. As you look at the Spiritual Report, we have less First Holy Communions and Confirmations. Nation-wide, families have been having fewer children since the financial crisis in 2008. But we still have a significant number of children in our parish. How can we encourage them to return to Mass and to our Parish? Our parish is well-known for being very welcoming. Whenever friends of mine from outside the parish come to Mass here, they always comment on how welcoming Our Lady of Lourdes Parish is. Having said that, is there anything else we can do to make people feel more valued, more welcomed, or more loved?

Please take home a copy of the Financial and Spiritual Report. Please discuss it as a family. We need to educate our children about these matters as well. If you have any ideas or suggestions, feel free to call, write or email me to let me know how we can work together to resolve this challenge. Our Lady of Lourdes Parish is <u>our</u> Parish and together <u>we</u> need to take responsibility for the parish's financial and spiritual health.

Thank you for your generosity to the parish over the years; for some of you that has been from the very start of the Parish (in the "old Korvettes!), 65 years ago! I am confident you will continue to respond to the needs of Our Lady of Lourdes Parish.

year (Super Raffle, Christmas and Easter)

Parish Programs: Religious Education fees, Parish Social Ministry donations, CYO, etc.

Auxiliary Revenue: Perquisites, candles, poor box, CD rack, convent rent, HeadStart rent, bulletin commission, donations

(Perquisites are the monies collected for weddings, funerals, baptisms, multiple Mass intentions)

Diocesan Collections: The "second collections" that are taken up for various needs in the country or the diocese. (The

parish does not keep these monies.)

Expenses

Salaries: Includes salaries and religious stipends of all employees-full time and part time.

Fringe Benefits: Medical insurance, dental insurance, FICA taxes, worker's compensation, pension, etc.

Parish Programs: Includes Religious Education, Parish Social Ministry expenses, CYO expenses, Ministry of

Consolation, etc.

School Subsidy: All parishes are mandated to give a percentage of their collection income to help support

Catholic Education in the Diocese. Normally, this is 12% - 15% of the regular collection.

Printing/Office Supplies: Includes postage, printing, computer fees and support, bank fees, telephone, internet,

contracted services, professional fees, equipment

Auxiliary: Candles, liturgical expenses, missalettes, Diocesan Assessment, etc.

Rectory Household: Food, laundry, supplies

Diocesan Collections: This is money received from the "Second Collections" that are taken up for various needs in the

country or diocese. (It is equal to the money in Income section: Diocesan Collections).

Buildings/Utilities

Gas, water, electric, contracted maintenance services, ordinary maintenance supplies,

Maintenance: building insurance, landscaping





Sharing the Gospel


