Keeping the Christmas Message Alive

By now, the Christmas tree has been taken down. All the Christmas decorations have been put away until next Christmas season. Our celebration of the arrival of the New Year, with all our resolutions made, has come and gone. Hopefully, our resolutions are still intact. And despite this season passing, we must never forget the crucial message, Emmanuel, God is with us. This message is timeless.

Right after Christmas I came down with bronchitis. Upon going to the doctor, I also found out I tested positive for COVID, a double whammy. Like others who tested positive from COVID, I had to quarantine for ten days. It meant staying home from work, staying away from family and friends, and staying away from my spiritual home, church. All of which I found quite difficult and frustrating. I am used to being a rather busy and somewhat social individual; being told to stop and isolate was a bitter pill to swallow.

It did not only affect me, but my wife, daughters, granddaughter and son-in-law had to get tested for COVID since we celebrated Christmas together. For my wife, it meant staying home from work until she tested negative for COVID. God is good; luckily all my family tested negative. I was also relieved when it came to my co-workers. Due to the Christmas holy days, I had not been in touch with anyone for over a week. This meant that the chances of me passing COVID to my co-workers was minimal. My office manager, who already does the work of more than two people, now had to do my work, for which I cannot thank her enough. For my brother deacons here at the parish, it meant that they would have to cover my parish obligations, which they did graciously.

This leads me to my period of quarantine. What was I going to do during quarantine for ten days? The first day, I spent cleaning my home office; it still looks clean, but I do not know for how much longer it will stay that way. My prayer life had increased, since I had more time to devote to it. I read several books, including Robert Cardinal Sarah's book *The Day Is Now Far Spent* and *Jesuit at Large: Essays and Reviews* by Paul V. Mankowski, S. J., each of which provided me with food for the soul. I must also confess I did some binge watching of *Hallmark* shows. Yes, I know the criticism of *Hallmark* shows: there are two plot lines, the same actors and actresses, and hundreds of ways to tell the same story. Hey, it helped me get through my period of isolation.

Yet, one of the things I missed most was going to worship at Mass. This past Thursday's Gospel of Mark dealt with the leper begging Jesus to heal him by saying, "If you wish, you can make me clean." It occurred to me that leper was kept away from society and worship by being unclean. In a very small way, that is how I felt. I have taken for granted that the opportunity for me to attend and worship at Mass would always be there. I felt somehow cheated. Bishop Barron's reflection on the healing of the leper from Thursday's Gospel reading resonates with me; I was truly able to understand it. He speaks about the importance of worship. "What is so important about worship? To worship is to order the whole of one's life toward the living God and, in doing so, to become interiorly and exteriorly rightly ordered. To worship is to signal to oneself what one's life is finally about. It's nothing that God needs, but it is very much something that we need."

This last line of Bishop Barron's rings true in my life, as well as in others. Truly God is with us and for us at all times and in all circumstances. I do not know if it is proper to offer another New Year's resolution at this point in the year, but I am going to do it anyway. My resolution is taken from a line in Charles Dickens' *Christmas Carol*, "I will honour Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year."

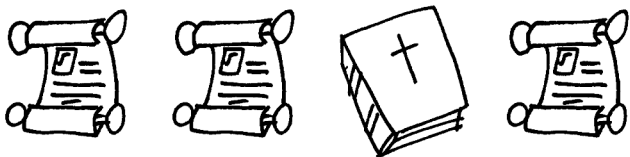
