#### Dear Parishioners:

As you know, many couples do not get married for years but simply co-habitate. When the couple finally decides to get married, many times the couple chooses not to get married in the Church. I am surprised by the number of young people who act surprised when I tell them that I am not allowed to officiate at their wedding unless it takes place in a Church building. When I ask the couple why they wouldn't consider getting married in the Church building, they say, "But I think it would be more meaningful to get married at the beach or at the vineyard. The setting is so perfect!" Or, I am told, "It would be so much more convenient for our guests to have everything, the wedding and the reception, in one single place." Or I am told, "God is everywhere, isn't He? Getting married under the stars is certainly getting married in the eyes of God."

So, here is my attempt to explain why the marriage of two Christians ought to take place in the Church building. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

Since marriage establishes the couple in a public state of life in the Church, it is fitting that its celebration be public, in the framework of a liturgical celebration, before the priest, the witnesses, and the assembly of the faithful.

The sacrament of Matrimony signifies the union of Christ and the Church... The presence of the Church's minister visibly expresses that marriage is an ecclesial (Church) reality.

Sacramental marriage is a liturgical act. It is therefore appropriate that is should be celebrated in the public liturgy of the Church.

Marriage is the celebration of a covenant of love, the promise of life-long sacrificial love where, as Jesus says in the gospel, "they are no longer two but one flesh." Do the bride and groom really know the full impact of what they are saying on the day of their marriage? Well, they do if they have been in the school of sacrificial love, a divine love pronounced and celebrated in the Church each and every day. In the Church we hear the words, "This is my body, given for you. This is my blood poured out for you." The covenant love of Calvary is re-presented in every Eucharistic celebration. Those who are getting married are promising to love in that same self-sacrificing way, making a total and sincere gift of self to the other for the rest of their lives.

In the next few weeks, I would like to write a little more about the sacrament of marriage.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.






