Dear Fellow Parishioners,

This weekend, as we continue celebrating Christ's glorious resurrection, we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday and remember in a special way God's unimaginable gift of mercy. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus appears to His disciples, saying "Peace be with you" and showing them His wounds. Then He breathes on them, saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." The Church considers this as being the time Jesus gave the Apostles and their successors -- our priests and bishops -- the authority to forgive sins and thus instituted the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are united to Christ, the Holy Spirit dwells among us and within us, stirring us to faith and allowing the Divine Life to take root in us. What great mercy this is! – that despite our sinfulness, we are drawn to our Triune God by an overflowing, never-ending love. Thus, the Sacrament of Confession is linked to the Divine Mercy.

When we approach the priest acting in the person of Christ (in persona Christi) for confession, we first humble ourselves to speak aloud our sins and shortcomings in true and honest repentance. In doing this, we meet Jesus who is waiting to immerse us in the unfathomable depths of His mercy. Through Jesus and in Jesus' name, the priest says at the end of confession: "I absolve you." Sins are not only forgiven, but the penitent is free... free from the chains of sin that bind us and prevent us from loving God as we should.

Jesus knew our hearts long to hear those words: *I forgive you*. *I absolve you*. The image of Divine Mercy, based on Saint Faustina's visions, shows Jesus having His left foot slightly in front of the other. It seems as if He is stepping out toward us, to meet us wherever we are, just as He came to the Upper Room to meet the disciples in the Gospel story. The disciples were afraid, so the doors were locked. But Jesus came - bringing peace.

In one of his sermons, St. Augustine said "were there no forgiveness of sins in the Church, there would be no hope of life to come or eternal liberation. Let us thank God who has given His Church such a gift." Thank God indeed, for the gift of the Sacrament of Reconciliation! During Holy Week, our parish offered many opportunities for this sacrament and many went for confession. For anyone who had not, I implore you to do take the time to do so. Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 4:00pm-4:45pm or you can call the parish office for an appointment.

And so, whatever sin is locked in our hearts today — whatever sin is holding us down, binding us, and preventing us from loving God as we should – we need to invite Jesus into that space. Let us allow Him in…to come and say, "Peace be with you." And let us meet Him in the confessional, where He waits longing to immerse each of us in His Divine Mercy.





Retrouvaille Weekend - You Can Help Heal Your Marriage

Do you feel alone? Are you frustrated or angry with each other?
Do you argue or have you just stopped talking to each other?
Does talking about it only make it worse?



The Retrouvaille Program is for married couples facing difficult challenges in their relationships.


