Dear Parishioners:

Happy Mothers' Day! To all the mothers in the world: thank you, thank you! May God bless you and reward you for all your sacrificial love that you so freely and generously bestow upon your families each and every day! As I often say to the kids, "Your mom is the best deal you'll ever have in your while life! They are the best – so let them know it today, and every day!

Pope Francis has commented upon mothers and I thought it would be a nice to hear from our Holy Father, Pope Francis:

To be a mother is a great treasure. Mothers, in their unconditional and sacrificial love for their children, are the antidote to individualism; they are the greatest enemies against war.

A society without mothers would be an inhumane society, as mothers always know how to show tenderness, devotion and moral strength, even in moments of greatest difficulty.

In a world often marked by selfishness, a large family is a school of solidarity and sharing; and this attitude is to the benefit of society as a whole.... I always thank the Lord in seeing mothers and fathers of large families, together with their children, committed to the life of the Church and of society.

It occurs to me: why is it mainly women, who to pass on the faith? Simply because the one who brought us Jesus is a woman. It is the path chosen by Jesus. He wanted to have a mother: the gift of faith comes to us through women, as Jesus came to us through Mary.

In addition, Saint Pope John Paul II once said:

Motherhood involves a special communion with the mystery of life, as it develops in the mother's womb. The mother is filled with wonder at this mystery of life, and 'understands' with unique intuition what is happening inside her. In the light of the 'beginning', the mother accepts and loves as a person the child she is carrying in her womb. This unique contact with the new human being developing within her gives rise to an attitude towards human beings - not only towards her own child, but every human being - which profoundly marks the woman's personality.

Cardinal Mindszenty was imprisoned by the Soviets in the 1950's. He wrote this reflection on mothers:

The most important person on earth is a mother. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral but she need not; she has built something more magnificent than any cathedral – a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body. The angels have not been blessed with such a grace. Angels cannot share in God's creative miracle to bring new saints to heaven; only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creature. God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation. What on God's good earth is more glorious than this: to be a mother!

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.
