Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Although the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus falls 19 days after Pentecost, which is seven weeks after Easter, the entire month of June is dedicated to this feast. In 2008, Pope Benedict XVI urged Catholics “to renew, in the month of June, their devotion to the Heart of Jesus.” The Sacred Heart of Jesus, as the Holy Father explained, “is a symbol of the Christian faith that is especially dear to ordinary people, because it expresses the “good news” of love in a simple and authentic way, the mystery of Incarnation and Redemption.” The Sacred Heart reminds us that Christ is not God simply appearing as man; He is truly man, just as He is truly God. As Pope Benedict XVI stated, “From the boundless horizon of His love, God entered the limitations of history and of the human condition.” The Sacred Heart therefore represents Christ’s love for all humankind.

Although we celebrate God’s abiding love at every Mass, we have most recently been celebrating it in a special way over the last few months, starting with the fifty days of the Easter season, Pentecost, The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On every occasion we remember and celebrate the mercy and unconditional love which Our Lord has for us. Although mysterious in certain ways, through faith, we believe that Our Lord’s love is so great that He has chosen to reveal Himself to us in Jesus, redeems us in the death and resurrection of Jesus and remains with us in the Holy Spirit. Another way to put this is that God’s love is endless; a God who never abandons us and will never give up on us.

With this promise, it is understandable that some may question where God has been over these past two years. We have experienced the pandemic, the attack on the Capital, gun violence, the war in Ukraine, division in our country, an economy in distress, and famine throughout the world to name a few. Of course, this does not include the personal sadness than many have experienced with struggles, illness, and death in their own families.

Although suffering and death will remain a mystery, these past few months of special celebrations have reminded us that Our Lord does not create suffering or death but overcomes them. Starting with the Easter season, we remember that even the women who discovered the empty tomb of Jesus were at first overcome with grief, sadness, and confusion, came to believe in the good news of Jesus’ resurrection. In the feast of Pentecost and of the Holy Trinity we experience the continuing presence of Our Lord. Finally, in the Feast of the Sacred Heart we acknowledge the apparitions of Jesus in the 1600’s to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, a member of the Visitation Sisters, through whom Jesus asked for devotion to His Sacred Heart. Jesus told Saint Margaret that He wanted to reveal His wounded Heart because He could not abide watching as countless people turned away from Him. I suppose in many ways, this feast is the culmination of the season of feasts where we in faith believe that God never abandons us but has an unending love for a struggling humanity. Jesus however also tells us of His desire for us to return His love. Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, does not stand in our place to love, but alongside us to give us the wisdom and strength to love. In these troubling times, we are not called to be the Messiah. Jesus has already saved us. It is also not up to us to figure out the mysteries of life. Our role instead is to spread the good news, live the gospel and, as Saint Francis said, “use words if necessary.” It is up to each one of us to love Our Lord and make His presence known by loving others as He commanded. In this way, the world may not come to understand, but will come to believe.

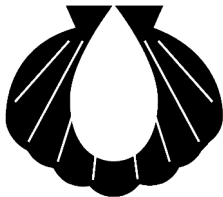

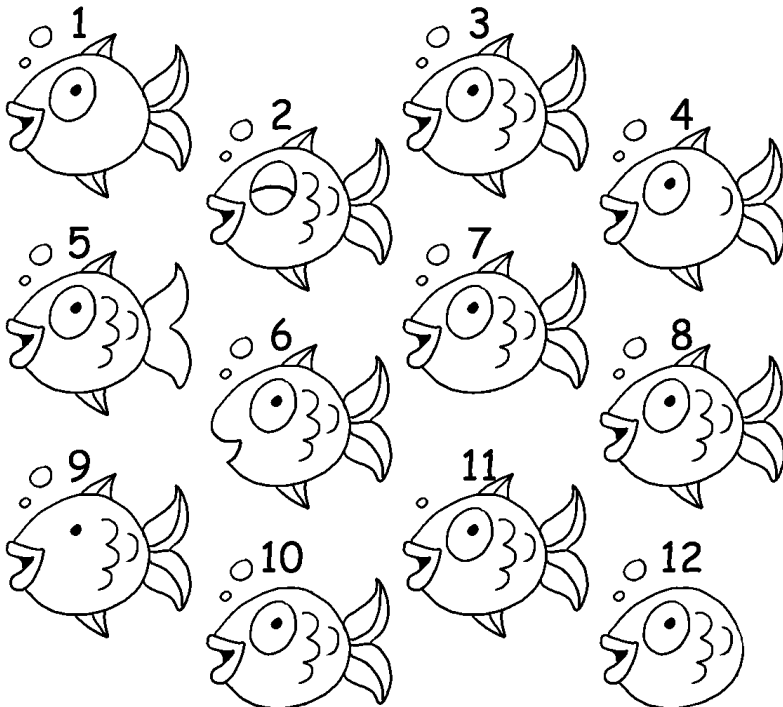
