The estimated weekly collection needed to maintain and operate our parish buildings, ministries, programs and salaries is \$17,800.

Dear Parishioners:

Congratulations to all our high school graduates! Our local public schools celebrated graduation this week and our Catholic high schools celebrated graduation over the past few weeks as well. While our graduates should be proud of their accomplishments, I would say that the best is yet to come. In a special way, I urge all graduates to listen to God's call in their life. Many times, at graduation, we ask the graduate, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" I would say the better question is to ask is: "What do you think GOD wants you to be when you grow up?" God has plan for each one of us; part of that plan may be a vocation to the priesthood and religious life. I urge all graduates to pray and ask for God's guidance for their life in the future.

I also encourage all our graduates who are going away to college to become connected to the Catholic community on their campus. Every college, secular or religious, has a Catholic group (often, but not always, called the **Newman Club or Newman Center**). The Newman Center provides pastoral support and Catholic ministry to students, in addition to providing a space to meet other Catholic students interested in growing in their faith. Summer has arrived and I hope that many of us have vacations, large or small, planned. As we all know, it has been a very difficult 2 years. I simply ask that you do NOT take a vacation from the Lord. Don't forget to go to Mass over the summer, even if you are in an unfamiliar place. You can simply "google" **MASS TIMES** and you can find a Catholic parish in the area of your vacation.

God's grace does not take a vacation from us; let us not take a vacation from Him! As I noted a last week, on the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), reception of the Eucharist is essential to drawing closer to Christ. Holiness is a life-long project and takes a spiritual discipline. It is not easy BUT it is possible for everyone!

I also respectfully ask that you continue to support our parish financially during the summer. As you can tell by reading the weekly bulletin, our collections have dropped off and the Parish does need your continued support, even during the summer months.

A special "thank you" to all of you donated blood last Monday. Over 50 pints of blood were donated. I appreciate all those who went out of the way to give the gift of life.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.

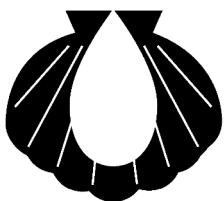

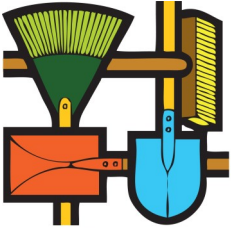
