The Weekly Financial Summary information was not available at the time of publication. It will be provided in a subsequent issue.

The estimated weekly collection needed to maintain and operate our parish buildings, ministries, programs and salaries is \$17,800.

Dear Parishioners:

I wanted to alert you to a proposed rule by the federal government, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). The HHS has proposed rule (RIN 0945-AA17). This proposed rule expands the definition of "sex discrimination" to include "termination of pregnancy" and "gender identity".

If HHS adopts this expanded definition, it could be construed to require healthcare professionals and providers to perform abortions and also require a health plan to cover abortions. This would be based on the theory that declining to do so would constitute sex discrimination.

The rule, if adopted, would similarly prohibit health professionals and other health care providers from declining to provide, and prohibit a health plan from declining to cover, gender-transition procedures, again on the theory that a decision not to participate or pay for such procedures constitutes sex discrimination.

I urge you to contact HHS to comment on the proposal rule. Comments must be received by HHS on or before October 3, 2022.

You may wish to use the following proposed message:

The proposal rule (RIN-AA17) is an affront to, and offends, the conscience rights of health care professionals and entities that seek to Do No Harm and to offer practical and life-giving care to the people they serve. Health care providers and insurers should not be coerced to perform or cover abortions or transgender procedures.

A decision not to provide or cover abortion or transgender procedures is not sex discrimination.

Provisions of the proposed rule that can be construed to require the providing for, or coverage of, such procedures violate rights of conscience and religious freedom as reflected in current federal conscience laws, including the Weldon Amendment.

For these reasons, I oppose the abortion and gender identity provisions of the proposed rule.

- 3. Follow directions on each page.
- 4. During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- 5. Select the class you wish to attend.
- 6. Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.




