#### Dear Parishioners:

This past week we celebrated All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. **All Saints' Day** is a solemn holy day celebrated annually on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven. Although millions, or even billions of people may already be saints, All Saints' Day observances focus on known saints -- that is those recognized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic Church. All Saints' Day is also commemorated by members of the Eastern Orthodox Church as well as some protestant churches, such as Lutheran and Anglican churches.

All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope Boniface IV, who consecrated the Pantheon at Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Pope Boniface IV also established All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints' Day.

However, All Saints' Day should not be confused with **All Souls' Day**, which is observed on November 2, and is dedicated to those who have died and not yet reached heaven.

The Catholic Church holds that "all who die in God's grace and friendship but still imperfectly purified" undergo the process of purification which the Church calls purgatory, "so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven".

Thus, All Souls' Day is a day for the commemoration of all the faithful departed, those baptized Christians who are believed to be in purgatory because they died with the guilt of lesser sins on their souls. Roman Catholic doctrine holds that the prayers of the faithful on earth will help cleanse these souls in order to fit them for the vision of God in heaven.

As a child, my mother would tell me to offer something up "for the abandoned souls in purgatory". On her deathbed, St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine, said to her son, "I only ask one thing: that you always remember me at the Eucharist." Every time we receive Holy Communion at Mass and we go back to our seats, I would encourage you to pray for your deceased loved ones: Remember your deceased loved ones at the Eucharist!

Sometimes at Mass, we pause for a moment in the midst of the Eucharistic Prayer to remember those who have died. I actually close my eyes and visually call to mind my deceased loved ones. At one Mass I visually remember my relatives and at other times I visually remember my friends who have died. I encourage you to do so as well. Do not let that moment of silence go blank; rather, remember and pray for a specific person (s).

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.




## Ministry of Consolation :: Mass of Remembrance






