Dear Parishioners:

Well, believe it or not, Thanksgiving is now over, and we are getting set for Christmas. But before we celebrate Christmas, I would strongly encourage everyone to enjoy and celebrate Advent. In many ways, we have lost the season of Advent to the secular forces focusing on Christmas. I would suggest that a great Christmas comes as a result of a great Advent.

Advent is traditionally a time of preparation, not merely waiting. The Church teaches us that during Advent we prepare for the two "comings of Christ". The first half of Advent focuses on the coming of Christ at the end of time. The second half of Advent focuses on the coming of Christ at Christmas. The lighting of the pink candle in the Advent wreath (which takes place on the third week of Advent) symbolizes the change in focus from the coming of Christ at the end of time to the coming of Christ at Christmas.

I offer us some quotes about Advent.

"At this Christmas when Christ comes, will He find a warm heart? Mark the season of Advent by loving and serving the others with God's own love and concern." - **Mother Teresa**,

"It is the beautiful task of Advent to awaken in all of us memories of goodness and thus to open doors of hope." - Pope Benedict XVI

The Lord is coming, always coming. When you have ears to hear and eyes to see, you will recognize him at any moment of your life. Life is Advent; life is recognizing the coming of the Lord." - Henri Nouwen

Here at Our Lady of Lourdes, we have a variety of spiritual offerings to help in that preparation for Christmas. You should have received a letter this past week, highlighting the various spiritual and family events here at Our Lady of Lourdes Church, both for you and the family. There is the old saying, "You can bring a horse to water, but you can't make him drink." These Advent opportunities are a way for the Parish "to bring you to the water" but only you can drink from that water. Drink the water! Take advantage of these Advent opportunities!

On Page 9, you will find a listing of the wonderful events for adults and children that will take place here. Please consult our bulletin or website <u>www.ollchurch.org</u> for greater details. I would like to highlight a few fun family events: After all the **morning Masses on Sunday, December 4,** stop by and visit **Bethlehem Village**; see Bethlehem as it was when Christ was born – including live animals! Also, on **Sunday morning, December 18,** come by for our **Family Christmas Fair**, including a visit by St. Nicholas! These events are great opportunities for families, young and old. Bring the grandchildren! And do not forget our Giving Tree! Let us see Christ in the disguise of the poor.



Requirements are as follows:

- 1. Attend a Virtus: Protecting God's Children class.
- 2. Undergo background screening.
- 3. Sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct.

Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:

- Log into the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.


