#### Dear Parishioners:

In the pastoral exhortation, Pope Francis wrote: "I invite all Christians, everywhere, at this very moment, to a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ, or at least an openness to letting Jesus encounter them; I ask all of you to do this unfailingly each day."

Let that be your Advent resolution: to have a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. As St. John tells us the Gospel: For God so loved the world that He sent His only Son that anyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life. God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world but that the world might be saved through Him (John 3:16 -17).

This is the person with whom Pope Francis wants us to have a personal encounter: the Christ who loved us so much that He became one of us and that same Christ died for us on the cross for our redemption.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.
