#### **Dear Parishioners:**

Because Christmas fell on Sunday this year, there have been a few changes liturgically. Usually, the Sunday after Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Family. But because Christmas fell on a Sunday, the Feast of the Holy Family was celebrated on December 30. In addition, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, will be celebrated on Monday, January 9.

But, this weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, the "manifestation" of the Christ-child to the whole world. This feast is also often referred to as "Little Christmas". In Europe, this is the day gifts are exchanged because this is the day the Wise Men gave their gifts to the Christ-child.

This feast is celebrated more enthusiastically in most European countries. In Cologne, Germany, the relics of the Wise Men will be shown to the people at a Solemn Mass. In Spain, there will be parades complete with the Wise Men riding on camels into the various Cathedrals. In Poland, this is a traditional time for all the parish priests to visit every home in their parish and to bless the home for the coming year.

Today, members of the Greek Orthodox Church participate in the great "Blessing of the Waters". After the Divine Liturgy, there is a procession from the Church to the beach, lake, etc. The Orthodox priest blesses the water by tossing a cross into the water. Men dive in to retrieve the cross. The person who finds the cross first and swims back receives a special blessing for the person and for his family.

Tomorrow, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It is the official end of the Christmas season, and now we will return to "ordinary time" until the start of the season of Lent. Before Vatican II, the Christmas season ended on February 2, which was called "Candlemas Day". This was the day when all the candles that were to be used in the church in the coming year were blessed. Now we call February 2 the Feast of Presentation. The Feast of the Presentation was also a day when many religious sisters entered the convent for their novitiate formation.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is an appropriate time to reflect upon our own baptisms. For the vast majority of us, we were baptized as infants. As infants, we could not choose to believe in Jesus or not; our parents and godparents made that choice on our behalf. However, as adults, we have to choose to live out the baptismal promises made by our parents and godparents. It is one of the reasons why everyone renews their baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. Each and every Easter, we are challenged to re-affirm, as adults, our baptismal promises. Baptism is not just an event in the past, but a challenge for the future for each one of us.

Baptism is not a simple ritual; baptism has actual, powerful effects! At our baptism, we were washed free from original sin, became a member of God's family and became a temple of the Holy Spirit. As St. Paul reminds us as well: "So you are no longer a slave (to sin) but a child (of God) and if a son or daughter (of God), then also an heir" (Galatians 4:4-7). So, by virtue of our Baptism, we have an inheritance: heaven, eternal life, gazing upon the face of God and being reunited with all our other family and friends who have died and gone before us to be with God.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.



# Mark Your Calendar: Bible Study Do you want to hear God speak to you?

For most of us, prayer becomes a source of frustration as we struggle to calm our minds to find even a few minutes to pray. In our busy lives, prayer is seen as a luxury, when in reality it is essential and fortifies the foundation of our lives. Do you pray and therefore have a healthy spiritual life? The good news is that you can overcome your difficulties with prayer, and it is easier than you might think. Therefore, join me as I will be leading an eight-week series entitled **Oremus** (*In Latin it means, "Let us pray"*). If you are feeling the Lord prompting you to be a part of this bible study, mark your calendar and call the parish office to register at (631) 661-3224 Ext. 2. We want to make sure there will be enough chairs and workbooks for everyone. The seating is limited to 108 people. Over the eight weeks, the Oremus Study program will teach you the essentials of an effective and fruitful prayer life. This is what Oremus can do for you:

- Become more deeply aware of God's presence in your life
- Discover the simple yet profound steps to Catholic prayer
- Learn how to respond to God and express yourself in prayer
- Discover how to hear God's voice in Scripture, in your heart, and in ordinary moments
- Learn how to overcome frustrations, distractions, and dryness in prayer
- Grow in your relationship with God and those around you, and much more....

Every class meets from 7:30pm to 9:15pm in the Parish Center. The eight dates are: **Tuesday**, April 25, May 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, June 6 & 13. The evening will consist of an opening prayer, a song and watching an excellent 30 minute video presentation by Fr. Mark Toups, a wonderful speaker from Louisiana. Then there will be a group discussion through small sharing groups with the workbook provided, closing announcements and a closing prayer. There is no set fee for the course but a free-will offering would be graciously accepted to help defray the cost of the workbooks. We will also be using the bible during this study. If you need a Catholic bible, the owner of the Advent Religious Store in Massapequa, Sarah Ryan, will bring bibles to Oremus for purchase.

As Fr. Mark has assisted me in my own prayer life through Oremus, I know he can assist you with yours. I highly recommend Oremus. I have been blessed to have been on several retreats where Fr. Mark was my spiritual director. He is the best at what he does. Fr. Mark was ordained in 2001 and is a priest for the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, Louisiana. He is presently the Pastor of Our Lady of the Isle parish in Grand Isle, Louisiana. He is also Vicar General and Director of the Office of Parish Support in his diocese and an adjunct faculty member for the Institute of Priestly Formation, specializing in communications, development and spiritual direction. Fr. Mark served for several years as Chancellor of his Diocese, the Pastor of two other parishes and Director of Seminarians. He received his Masters of Divinity degree from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. Fr. Mark is the author of Ascension Press resources: Oremus: A Catholic Guide to Prayer \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Mary \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Joseph. He brings a wide range of experience to this bible study.

I hope you will prayerfully consider joining me.

The facilitator helps the sharing group to remain on topic during the time of discussion. The training session is set for Tuesday, April 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:30pm in the Parish Center. Call it one of the mercies of the road: that we see it only by stages as it opens before us, as it comes into our keeping, step by single step.


There is nothing for it but to go, and by our going take the vows the pilgrim takes:



Note: If you already have a Virtus account (<u>www.Virtus.org</u>), have signed the Code of Conduct and attended the Class, all you need to do is initiate the updated background screening through Sterling Volunteers.

#### Requirements are as follows:

- 1. Attend a Virtus: Protecting God's Children class.
- 2. Undergo background screening.
- 3. Sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct.

#### **Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:**

- Log into the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.



## **Sharing the Gospel**


