We Are Called!

For the last two weeks, our readings have shown us a common theme of Evangelization. In last week's Gospel, we see John the Baptist point to Jesus and exclaim, "Behold the Lamb of God!" Unlike Luke's Gospel, which points out John and Jesus being related, John's Gospel tells us that Jesus' identity was revealed to John through the work he was sent to do. John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus. Throughout sacred scripture, we see how the prophets foretold the coming of our Savior, now John identifies Jesus as our Savior.

Matthew continues with this week's Gospel telling us of John the Baptist's arrest, as we see Jesus selecting His Apostles. Catherine Cory, in her reflection, points how Matthew is addressing the Jewish people. This is especially true by using the phrase "the kingdom of heaven is at hand". It is out of respect for the Jewish people that Matthew does not use "kingdom of God.' The Jewish people do not speak the name of God aloud. Whether we consider it the kingdom of God or the kingdom of heaven, Jesus has come to preach the Good News.

The Apostles will accompany Jesus throughout his public ministry. The Great Commission of the disciples in Matthew 28:16-20, takes place on a mountain in Galilee after the Resurrection of Jesus. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to Me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always , to the close of the age."

We too are called to spread the Good News. In last week's homily, Father Charles pointed to some ways we can accomplish this. He used the example of parents encouraging their children to go to Mass. It takes perseverance; Father Charles advised parents to continue to extend the invitation to attend Mass. You never know when your invitation will be accepted. The invitation to Mass should not be limited to one's children. There might be other friends or family members who have been away from the Church for a while.

Talking about our faith might be a little tricky. Perhaps we think of it as a daunting task, or maybe we are afraid we might offend someone. Maybe we are concerned about what people think of us, that we are out of touch with the real world. Father Charles warns us not to get into an argument over religion; it does not serve the mission. One way to combat this fear is to gain more knowledge of our faith, perhaps looking into Adult Faith Formation. Father Charles has some room left in his workshop on prayer in April; that might be a good place to start. You can also check the Diocesan website for additional opportunities to learn more about our faith.

Our Sunday Visitor's Editorial Board advises its readers not to sit on the sidelines when it comes to evangelization. The title of the article gives a sense of urgency; "Every Catholic is called to mission." One quote from the article that caught my attention was, "It can be tempting to think that others have a gift for evangelization or the duty to share the Faith, but the fact of the matter is that every Catholic is called to share in the Church's mission, to make Christ known and loved throughout the world." For many, they do not think they have what it takes to participate effectively in the life of the Church. Another quote from the article which resonated with me was, "Each baptized Christian, through prayer, works of service, presence at Mass and more, has something to offer the community of believers."

In *A Devotional Commentary on Matthew*, edited by Leo Zanchettin, we are reminded of Jesus' words after the commissioning of His disciples, "I am with you always, to the close of the age." Jesus' promise is for us as well. He will be with us as we carry out our call to mission. The commentary states, "He will help us to overcome fear, pride or anything else that deters us from preaching His word." There are other ways we can accomplish this. We can look at the Corporal Works of Mercy such as: feeding the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, visit the sick, clothe the naked, visit the imprisoned, and bury the dead. Along with our corporal works of mercy should be prayer. The McGrath Institute from Notre Dame reinforces the idea of integrating prayer and action, with the works of mercy.

I would like to leave you with one more quote from the Editorial Board of Our Sunday Visitor; "Every baptized Catholic is, at one and the same time, a witness to and a living instrument of the Church." There's work to do; let's get to it.

Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:

- Log into the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.

Mark Your Calendar: Bible Study Do you want to hear God speak to you?

For most of us, prayer becomes a source of frustration as we struggle to calm our minds to find even a few minutes to pray. In our busy lives, prayer is seen as a luxury, when in reality it is essential and fortifies the foundation of our lives. Do you pray and therefore have a healthy spiritual life? The good news is that you can overcome your difficulties with prayer, and it is easier than you might think. Therefore, join me as I will be leading an eight-week series entitled **Oremus** (*In Latin it means, "Let us pray"*). If you are feeling the Lord prompting you to be a part of this bible study, mark your calendar and call the parish office to register at (631) 661-3224 Ext. 2. We want to make sure there will be enough chairs and workbooks for everyone. The seating is limited to 108 people. Over the eight weeks, the Oremus Study program will teach you the essentials of an effective and fruitful prayer life. This is what Oremus can do for you:

- Become more deeply aware of God's presence in your life
- Discover the simple yet profound steps to Catholic prayer
- Learn how to respond to God and express yourself in prayer
- Discover how to hear God's voice in Scripture, in your heart, and in ordinary moments
- Learn how to overcome frustrations, distractions, and dryness in prayer
- Grow in your relationship with God and those around you, and much more....

Every class meets from 7:30pm to 9:15pm in the Parish Center. The eight dates are: **Tuesday**, April 25, May 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, June 6 & 13. The evening will consist of an opening prayer, a song and watching an excellent 30 minute video presentation by Fr. Mark Toups, a wonderful speaker from Louisiana. Then there will be a group discussion through small sharing groups with the workbook provided, closing announcements and a closing prayer. There is no set fee for the course but a free-will offering would be graciously accepted to help defray the cost of the workbooks. We will also be using the bible during this study. If you need a Catholic bible, the owner of the Advent Religious Store in Massapequa, Sarah Ryan, will bring bibles to Oremus for purchase.

As Fr. Mark has assisted me in my own prayer life through Oremus, I know he can assist you with yours. I highly recommend Oremus. I have been blessed to have been on several retreats where Fr. Mark was my spiritual director. He is the best at what he does. Fr. Mark was ordained in 2001 and is a priest for the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, Louisiana. He is presently the Pastor of Our Lady of the Isle parish in Grand Isle, Louisiana. He is also Vicar General and Director of the Office of Parish Support in his diocese and an adjunct faculty member for the Institute of Priestly Formation, specializing in communications, development and spiritual director of Seminarians. He received his Masters of Divinity degree from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. Fr. Mark is the author of Ascension Press resources: Oremus: A Catholic Guide to Prayer \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Joseph. He brings a wide range of experience to this bible study.

I hope you will prayerfully consider joining me.

Sharing the Gospel


