Dear Parishioners:

As you know, our Parish named after our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Lourdes. Lourdes is located in southern France, at the foothills of the Pyrenees mountains.

On 11 February 1858, a 14-year-old peasant girl, Bernadette Soubirous, claimed a beautiful lady appeared to her in the remote Grotto of Massabielle. This lady later identified herself as "the Immaculate Conception". Bernadette experienced eighteen apparitions between February 11 and July 26 during 1858 from the Virgin Mary in the nearby grotto. It was only at the ninth apparition that the healing powers were revealed. As of February 2018, there are 70 authenticated miracles that have taken place at Lourdes.

Bernadette was preparing for her First Holy Communion. One of Bernadette's chores was to collect wood for the fire. On that cold day in February 1858, Bernadette and 2 companions headed off to the Gave River to collect pieces of wood. The 2 companions ran ahead and left Bernadette struggling to keep up. As Bernadette was taking off her shoes to make her way through the river, she was startled by a peculiar wind and rustling sound. Bernadette looked up towards the grotto and the caves on the riverbank. Near the opening of the grotto, Bernadette glanced and noticed the cave was suddenly filled with golden light. Lifting up her eyes, she saw a lady of great beauty, dressed in a pure white robe with a blue sash, a veil over her head, a rosary clasped in her hands and yellow roses at her feet. Bernadette fell involuntarily upon her knees, gazing enraptured at the lovely Lady, who smiled lovingly at Bernadette and then disappeared.

The mysterious Lady from heaven appeared in all, eighteen times to the little girl and among other things told her to drink the water from a mysterious fountain which was not yet observed. Bernadette scratched in the sand at a spot indicated, and water began to trickle through the earth; after a few days there gushed forth every day 27,000 gallons of pure, clear spring water, and this water still flows.

Bernadette was asked by Our Lady of Lourdes, who always showed her a sweet heavenly courtesy, to request the priest to have a church built on the spot, that processions should be made to the grotto, that people should drink of the water. The main emphasis of her message was that the faithful should visit the grotto in order to do penance for their sins and for those of the world.

Bernadette entered the convent and became a sister. She died at any early age; she was only 34 years old at her death. St. Bernadette is an "incorruptible". When her body was exhumed, her body was found to not have decayed. Her body can be seen today under glass in Nevers, France.

Today Lourdes is seen as a significant sight and a world center of pilgrimage and a special place of gathering between God and people. There is a wonderful movie, *The Song of Bernadette*, that I would encourage everyone to see. It won 4 Academy Awards, including Best Actress for Jennifer Jones. We will be showing the movie, this **Saturday, Feb. 11 from 1:00pm – 3:30pm in the Parish Center**. We will have refreshments!



Requirements are as follows:

- 1. Attend a Virtus: Protecting God's Children class.
- 2. Undergo background screening.
- 3. Sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct.

Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:

- Log into the Virtus website: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.

<u>Oremus Bible Study</u>:

Now offered in the Afternoon as well!!!!

Afternoon class: 1:00pm to 2:45pm in the Parish Center (limited seating – 72 people) Evening class: 7:30pm – 9:15pm in the All Purpose Room (limited seating -160 people)

If you already signed up for the evening session but want to switch to the afternoon, please call the rectory so they can make the change. The eight dates of the bible study are: **Tuesday**, April 25, May 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, June 6 & 13. The bible study will consist of an opening prayer, a song and watching an excellent 30 minute teaching video presentation by Fr. Mark Toups, a wonderful speaker from Louisiana. Then there will be a group discussion through small sharing groups with the workbook provided, closing announcements and a closing prayer. There is no set fee for the course but a free-will offering would be graciously accepted to help defray the cost of the work-books and supplies. We will also be using the bible during this study for your daily prayer. If you need a Catholic bible, the owner of the Advent Religious Store in Massapequa, Sarah Ryan, will bring bibles to Oremus for purchase.

Do you want to hear God speak to you?

For most of us, prayer becomes a source of frustration as we struggle to calm our minds to find even a few minutes to pray. In our busy lives, prayer is seen as a luxury, when in reality it is essential and fortifies the foundation of our lives. Do you pray and therefore have a healthy spiritual life? The good news is that you can overcome your difficulties with prayer, and it is easier than you might think. Over the eight weeks, the Oremus Study program will teach you the essentials of an effective and fruitful prayer life. This is what Oremus can do for you:

- Become more deeply aware of God's presence in your life
- Discover the simple yet profound steps to Catholic prayer
- Learn how to respond to God and express yourself in prayer
- Discover how to hear God's voice in Scripture, in your heart, and in ordinary moments
- Learn how to overcome frustrations, distractions, and dryness in prayer
- Grow in your relationship with God and those around you, and much more....

Therefore, join me as I will be leading an eight-week series entitled **Oremus** (*in Latin it means, "Let us pray"*). If you are feeling the Lord prompting you to be a part of this bible study, mark your calendar and call the parish office to register at 631-661-3224 Ext. 2. This is to make sure there will be enough chairs, workbooks and supplies for everyone. The seating for the afternoon group is limited to 72 people and the evening group is limited to 160.

As Fr. Mark has assisted me in my own prayer life through Oremus, I know he can assist you with yours. I highly recommend Oremus. I have been blessed to have been on several retreats where Fr. Mark was my spiritual director. He is the best at what he does. Fr. Mark was ordained in 2001 and is a priest for the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, Louisiana. He is presently the Pastor of Our Lady of the Isle parish in Grand Isle, Louisiana. He is also Vicar General and Director of the Office of Parish Support in his diocese and an adjunct faculty member for the Institute of Priestly Formation, specializing in communications, development and spiritual direction. Fr. Mark served several years as Chancellor of his Diocese, the pastor of two other parishes and Director of Seminarians. He received his Master of Divinity degree from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. Fr. Mark is the author of Ascension Press resources : Oremus: A Catholic Guide to Prayer \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Mary \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Joseph. He brings a wide range of experience to this bible study.

Calling all facilitators: we need facilitators for our small sharing groups during the 8 weeks of the Oremus bible study. It's not difficult, I will train you. The facilitator helps the sharing group to remain on topic during the time of discussion. The training session is set for Tuesday, April 18th at 1:00pm for the afternoon group and 7:30pm in the Parish Center for the evening group. 


