Dear Parishioners:

This Tuesday will be Valentine's Day; interestingly enough, in the Church, it is the feast day of Saints Cyril and Methodius, not the most romantic names that I have heard! So, I thought I would dwell a little bit on the topic of love and marriage, and the state of marriage in the Church.

Nowadays, as you know, many couples do not get married but simply co-habitate for years. When the couple finally decides to get married, many times the couple chooses not to get married in the Church. I am surprised by the number of young people who act surprised when I tell them that I am not allowed to officiate at their wedding unless it takes place in a Church building. When I ask the couple why they wouldn't consider getting married in the Church building, they say, "But I think it would be more meaningful to get married at the beach or at the vineyard. The setting is so perfect!" Or, I am told, "It would be so much more convenient for our guests to have everything, the wedding and the reception, in one single place." Or I am told, "God is everywhere, isn't He?"

So, here is my attempt to explain why the marriage of two Christians ought to take place in the Church building. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states:

Since marriage establishes the couple in a public state of life in the Church, it is fitting that its celebration be public, in the framework of a liturgical celebration, before the priest, the witnesses, and the assembly of the faithful.

The sacrament of Matrimony signifies the union of Christ and the Church... The presence of the Church's minister visibly expresses that marriage is an ecclesial (Church) reality.

Sacramental marriage is a liturgical act. It is therefore appropriate that is should be celebrated in the public liturgy of the Church.

Marriage is the celebration of a covenant of love, the promise of life-long sacrificial love where, as Jesus says in the gospel, "they are no longer two but one flesh." Do the bride and groom really know the full impact of what they are saying on the day of their marriage? Well, they do if they have been in the school of sacrificial love, a divine love pronounced and celebrated in the Church each and every day. In the Church we hear the words, "This is my body, given for you. This is my blood poured out for you." The covenant love of Calvary is re-presented in every Eucharistic celebration. Those who are getting married are promising to love in that same self-sacrificing way, making a total and sincere gift of self to the other for the rest of their lives.

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.

- 2. Undergo background screening.
- 3. Sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct.

#### Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:

- Log into the Virtus website: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.

# <u>Oremus Bible Study</u>:

## Now offered in the Afternoon as well!!!!

Afternoon class: 1:00pm to 2:45pm in the Parish Center (limited seating – 72 people) Evening class: 7:30pm – 9:15pm in the All Purpose Room (limited seating -160 people)

*If you already signed up for the evening session but want to switch to the afternoon, please call the rectory so they can make the change.* The eight dates of the bible study are: **Tuesday**, April 25, May 2, 9, 16, 23, 30, June 6 & 13. The bible study will consist of an opening prayer, a song and watching an excellent 30 minute teaching video presentation by Fr. Mark Toups, a wonderful speaker from Louisiana. Then there will be a group discussion through small sharing groups with the workbook provided, closing announcements and a closing prayer. There is no set fee for the course but a free-will offering would be graciously accepted to help defray the cost of the work-books and supplies. We will also be using the bible during this study for your daily prayer. If you need a Catholic bible, the owner of the Advent Religious Store in Massapequa, Sarah Ryan, will bring bibles to Oremus for purchase.

#### Do you want to hear God speak to you?

For most of us, prayer becomes a source of frustration as we struggle to calm our minds to find even a few minutes to pray. In our busy lives, prayer is seen as a luxury, when in reality it is essential and fortifies the foundation of our lives. Do you pray and therefore have a healthy spiritual life? The good news is that you can overcome your difficulties with prayer, and it is easier than you might think. Over the eight weeks, the Oremus Study program will teach you the essentials of an effective and fruitful prayer life. This is what Oremus can do for you:

- Become more deeply aware of God's presence in your life
- Discover the simple yet profound steps to Catholic prayer
- Learn how to respond to God and express yourself in prayer
- Discover how to hear God's voice in Scripture, in your heart, and in ordinary moments
- Learn how to overcome frustrations, distractions, and dryness in prayer
- Grow in your relationship with God and those around you, and much more....

Therefore, join me as I will be leading an eight-week series entitled **Oremus** (*in Latin it means, "Let us pray"*). If you are feeling the Lord prompting you to be a part of this bible study, mark your calendar and call the parish office to register at 631-661-3224 Ext. 2. This is to make sure there will be enough chairs, workbooks and supplies for everyone. The seating for the afternoon group is limited to 72 people and the evening group is limited to 160.

As Fr. Mark has assisted me in my own prayer life through Oremus, I know he can assist you with yours. I highly recommend Oremus. I have been blessed to have been on several retreats where Fr. Mark was my spiritual director. He is the best at what he does. Fr. Mark was ordained in 2001 and is a priest for the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, Louisiana. He is presently the Pastor of Our Lady of the Isle parish in Grand Isle, Louisiana. He is also Vicar General and Director of the Office of Parish Support in his diocese and an adjunct faculty member for the Institute of Priestly Formation, specializing in communications, development and spiritual direction. Fr. Mark served several years as Chancellor of his Diocese, the pastor of two other parishes and Director of Seminarians. He received his Master of Divinity degree from Notre Dame Seminary in New Orleans. Fr. Mark is the author of Ascension Press resources : Oremus: A Catholic Guide to Prayer \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Mary \ Rejoice! Advent Meditations with Joseph. He brings a wide range of experience to this bible study.

The facilitator helps the sharing group to remain on topic during the time of discussion. 


