Can you believe it's Lent already?

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Yes, the season of Lent is upon us! It starts this Wednesday - Ash Wednesday. Indeed, the earth has almost (short by about a week) completely revolved around the sun since the last time we had ashes imposed on our foreheads. Lent is a season where we set our minds and hearts more intently on the suffering and death of our Lord Jesus Christ, so that we will be ready to welcome and embrace the good news of his Resurrection. It is a time to unite our own suffering with the suffering of Christ and the suffering members of the Church through fasting, abstinence, prayer, and almsgiving - the pillars of Lent. In addition to our individual observances of these pillars, there will be many opportunities of Lenten observances that our church will be offering. I encourage you all to participate in one or some of them, particularly the weekly Stations of the Cross on Fridays.

As we journey through these coming 40 days of Lent, we may find ourselves stumbling or losing our way. But let's not be discouraged, let's pick ourselves up, get back on the road - let's call on our Blessed Mother to pray for us. Below are a few quotations that might help us as we navigate through the journey of this season.

St. Augustine:

"Do you wish your prayer to fly toward God? Make for it two wings: fasting and almsgiving."

Dallas Willard, American philosopher:

"Fasting confirms our utter dependence upon God by finding in Him a source of sustenance beyond food."

St. Catherine of Siena:

"Nothing great is ever achieved without much enduring."

Pope Francis:

"Lent comes providentially to awaken us, to shake us from our lethargy."

Catherine Doherty, spiritual writer:

"Lent is a time of going very deeply into ourselves... What is it that stands between us and God? Between us and our brothers and sisters? Between us and life, the life of the Spirit? Whatever it is, let us relentlessly tear it out, without a moment's hesitation."

St. Francis de Sales:

"Have patience with all things, but first of all with yourself."

Henri Nouwen:

"O Lord, make this Lenten season different from the other ones. Let me find you again. Amen."

Father Mike Schmitz:

"Seek a relationship when you pray, not answers. You won't always find answers, but you will always find Jesus."

Bishop Robert Barron:

"The bodily aches of fasting and abstinence give way to virtue. Although it may feel like we are taking something away from ourselves, it is better understood as a reorienting of our appetites in order to answer the call to holiness."

- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.

SEEKING "ROOM IN THE INN" FOR A REFUGEE FAMILY OF 3 FROM UKRAINE

In the Fall of 2021, the Sisters of Saint Joseph began accepting refugee families from both Afghanistan and Ukraine into their Motherhouse in Brentwood. The experience has been both enlightening and rewarding. At the moment, we have reached our capacity. Presently, we have a family of 3 that is looking for an apartment in the Bay Shore/Brentwood area that they could "rent" at least until June so that their 8 year old daughter might be able to finish the school year without further disruption in her life. (Needless to say, their funds are extremely limited – they are only able to pay about \$500-\$800 monthly). We are hoping (and praying) that someone might know of a basement apartment or a small unit in a two family home that they would be willing to rent to this refugee family. This family unit (Mother, Father, 8 year old daughter and a 2 pound Yorkie) are extremely independent. They speak English and they own a car. The father has a job (remote) and the mother is going to school to learn English. The little girl is in 4th grade.




