Dear Parishioners:

We are now entering the fifth week of Lent; it seems that we just celebrated Ash Wednesday last week! But, if you have not gotten "into Lent" yet, don't despair. We still have 2 weeks to go before Easter.

I would like to encourage everyone to "plan ahead" and look at Holy Week. I especially urge parents with younger children to come to the special Holy Week Children's Liturgies. We need to introduce our young people to the beauty of Holy Week and the various Children's Liturgies are great ways to do just that.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who made the **Special Live-Edition: "Holy Week in Review" Docudrama** held last weekend after all the Sunday Masses so meaningful. Under the leadership of Cathy Danowski (and the carpentry skills of her husband, Rick), the Committee put in a lot of time and effort to make Holy Week more understandable to all of us, by presenting it as a news broadcast.

This past Monday, we celebrated the Feast of St. Joseph, the husband of Mary. **St. Joseph**, the patron saint of the Church, was hand-chosen by God to be the husband of Mary and the foster-father of Jesus. We know very little about Joseph but, to me, he is the "un-sung hero" of the Bible. He simply and faithfully took care of Mary and Jesus. He is a great role model for all husbands and fathers. With no fanfare, Joseph simply did what was needed to get done.

Actually, St. Joseph has two Feast days: March 19: Joseph, the husband of Mary and May 1: Joseph, the Worker. Pope Francis gave us this prayer for us to pray in honor of St. Joseph:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

On Saturday, we celebrated the **Feast of the Annunciation** (9 months before Christmas, the birth of Christ). We read about the Annunciation in the Gospel of St. Luke (Chapter 1, verses 26 – 38). The most important decision in the history of the world took place when Mary said "Yes" to the Angel Gabriel to be the mother of the Son of God, our Lord Jesus Christ. Because of that "yes", God's plan to save us began in earnest! Often that "yes" is referred to as Mary's "fiat", a Latin phrase that means "let it be done"; as you may recall, in saying "yes", Mary actually said, "Let it be done to me according to Your word."

Remember: Together, we can do something beautiful for God.

Are You In Need of Mercy? Divine Mercy Prayer Service April 16, 2023 - 3:30pm-5:30pm - in the Church

Are you familiar with the Divine Mercy of Jesus? On February 22, 1931, Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ appeared to a nun by the name of Sister Maria Faustina. She was from the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Cracow, Poland. Jesus appeared to her bringing with Him a wonderful message of Mercy for all people. In the apparition she saw Jesus standing before her in a white robe. With His left hand He was pulling back his garment revealing His heart, out of which came white and red rays (symbolic of the blood and water which flowed from His side when pierced with a lance on the cross. This image reminds us of the tender Mercy of God which was shed upon the world at Calvary). It is in the heart of Jesus that we find love, mercy, strength, hope and healing. Jesus said to St. Faustina, the greater the sinner, the greater their right to My mercy. No matter what sin one commits, if their heart is truly repentant, God will forgive them.

This image of Jesus as He appeared to St. Faustina can be seen hanging on the wall in the area of the church where the tabernacle used to be.

In the year 2000, Pope John Paul II (now a Saint) canonized Sister Faustina a saint, making this apparition worthy of belief. The Holy Father also declared the Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the whole Church.

Therefore, as a parish, we will be celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday on **April 16, 2023**. We will praise God for His eternal love and abundant mercy. How? There will be a prayer service in the Church from 3:30pm to 5:30pm. The prayer service will consist of exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, readings from scripture, praying the chaplet of Divine Mercy (which consists of various prayers which Jesus gave to Sister Faustina to give to the world. This chaplet is prayed on ordinary rosary beads), the sorrowful mystery of the rosary, singing and the opportunity to venerate the image of the Divine Mercy and the first class relic of Saint Faustina. All are welcome to join us.

In the apparition of Jesus to St. Faustina, He also gives us the Divine Mercy Novena to pray and like all Novenas it is 9 days. The Novena begins on Good Friday and ends the day before Divine Mercy Sunday. The Novena is very unique because we are praying for God's intentions, not our own. Jesus gave St. Faustina the intentions that He would like us to pray for each day. It is a most beautiful and selfless prayer. There will be red Novena pamphlets at the doors of the church in case you need one.

A huge and merciful gift given us on Divine Mercy Sunday is that we can receive a plenary indulgence. Jesus promised this to us through St. Faustina when He reminded us of His great mercy. What is a plenary indulgence? It is the total remission (washing away) of temporal punishment due to sin. When I confess my sin with a sincere and contrite heart, I am totally forgiven but the temporal (the here and now) damage that was done to others (and myself) as a result of my sin remains. That's why we do penance to try to repair the damage we have done. That is what purgatory is about. That's why a plenary indulgence is a merciful gift from the Lord. How can one receive it? Here are the requirements: One must go to Mass and receive Holy Communion on the feast of Divine Mercy, April 15th - 16th. One must go to confession within 10 days of the feast (either before or after), pray the Apostles creed (which is your profession of faith), take a few moments to reflect on the mercy you have received in your life, pray one Our Father and Hail Mary for the Pope's intention and, lastly, have a desire to be freed from the attachment to sin.

Several years ago Fr. Charles and his sister recorded a Divine Mercy Album which consists of the Divine Mercy Chaplet presented in three different ways: scriptural, traditional and sung. It also has the Litany of the Divine Mercy and several reflection songs. The purpose of the CD is to help you pray and reflect more deeply on the love of our Lord expressed in His passion. The CDs are sold through their music ministry website: www.frcharleslaurie.com.

- 1. Attend a Virtus: Protecting God's Children class.
- 2. Undergo background screening.
- 3. Sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct.

Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:

- Log into the Virtus website: www.Virtus.org.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.






