On the Road to Emmaus

The Gospel from Luke about the two disciples who walked with Jesus on the road to Emmaus is one of the most beautiful, hopeful and inspiring resurrection gospels. Yet, after Jesus told His disciples that He would suffer, die and be resurrected on the third day, the disciples were in a deep state of grief appearing to lose all hope that any sense of joy would ever return. They certainly did not think for a moment that Jesus had risen from the dead.

Many of us have experienced the loss of a loved one. Even when we are expecting their death, many times we fall into a deep sense of despair and maybe even depression. We are numb, bewildered, feel abandoned and deeply feel the pain of separation. The joy in our lives and the sense of hope feel like they are a million miles away. In fact, we believe at a time like this that we will never feel normal again. I suppose the disciples felt disillusioned in this way. In Luke's gospel, even as Jesus drew near and walked alongside them, "their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him".

As much as it may have appeared that the disciples understood what Jesus tried to tell them about who He was and what His mission on earth was all about, there are some biblical scholars who believe the disciples, like most people, expected a Messiah who was powerful in earthly ways. They felt that the Messiah was supposed to be a strong military and political leader to set Israel free from Israel's enemies. In Luke's Gospel, we hear Jesus say to these two bewildered disciples, "how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets spoke"! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?" The disciples didn't recognize Jesus because they lost their faith and trust in Him. It was not until Jesus opened the scriptures by explaining what the prophets had spoken about that they then came to realize that Jesus was in fact the fulfillment of the scriptures, "Were our hearts not burning within us while He spoke to us on the way." It was in conversation and the breaking of the bread, fellowship, and relationship, that the disciples came to recognize Him, "And it happened that, while He was with them at table, He took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and gave it to them."

We, unlike the disciples, have the gift of seeing how the story evolved. We know how it did not end on Good Friday, rather we have seen the resurrection. God's plan for Jesus far outweighed anything that the disciples could have imagined. Although we are naturally torn by the loss of a loved one, we know that there is something beyond the horror of the crucifixion, beyond death itself. Our God is a loving and compassionate God, one who keeps promises to raise us up as Jesus was raised up.

Jesus' presence did not end on the walk to Emmaus. Our gospel from Luke is a very clear sign that our Lord is truly experienced every time we attend Mass. He is present in Scripture and in the Eucharist. In the last section of Matthew's Gospel before the passion and resurrection, Matthew presents us with some of Jesus' most powerful words spoken. It is in the section called "The Judgment of Nations". Here Jesus places the "sheep on his right", and says, "Come, you who are blessed by My father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry, and you gave Me food, naked and you clothed Me." In response to the righteous who said, "when did we see you hungry, naked or a stranger", the King will say to them in reply, "Amen I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of Mine, you did it for Me". Our risen Lord is experienced at the Mass every time it is celebrated. Jesus is also experienced by others when we allow Him to work through us in a loving and compassionate manner, thus becoming the hands and heart of Jesus, especially to the most vulnerable who are most in need.


