Dear Parishioners:

Happy Father's Day! May God bless and guide our fathers and may God the Father reward all our dads for all their sacrificial love for their children. The first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910 in the state of Washington. However, it was not until 1952 that the day became a national holiday (58 years after Pres. Woodrow Wilson made Mother's Day a national holiday).

Some Father's Day "fun facts":

Father's Day is the 4th biggest day for greeting cards (after Christmas/Valentine's Day and Mother's Day). In Germany, on Father's Day, men drink all day at beer gardens.

In Thailand, Father's Day is celebrated in December, and everyone wears yellow.

Fathers are given bright yellow canna flowers (similar to a lily).

In Nepal, there is a ceremony in which sons touch their heads to their father's feet and daughters touch their heads to their father's hands.

Pope Francis has made some comments about fathers:

Like St. Joseph, fathers, too, must be guardians in age, wisdom, and grace. Being a father is not easy since it requires a lot of grace and patience. Fathers are so necessary as examples and guides for our children in wisdom and virtue. Without father figures, young people often feel orphaned; left adrift at a critical moment in their growth and development. "A society without fathers is a society of orphans." I ask that you have the grace to be very close to your children, letting them grow but being by their side. They need you, your presence, to be there, and your love.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Father Charles. He is responsible for the wonderful Bible study over the past 2 months. It took a great deal of time and effort and we all owe Fr. Charles a big "thank you". Stay tuned to for Scripture study opportunities in the Fall.

Also, thank you to the Knights of Columbus for setting up the chairs each week. Under the watchful eye of Ray Taffner, they did a great job each week.



The Alzheimer's Disease Resource Center strives to make a positive impact in the lives of Long Island residents navigating Alzheimer's Disease and other forms of cognitive impairment. We provide care, support, life enrichment programs, advocacy, educational programs, and professional caregiver training. Our services to families are always **FREE** of charge.

Art Therapy stimulates and enriches those struggling with memory loss and opens alternate pathways for expression and recollection. Projects are appropriate for people with Alzheimer's and other cognitive impairments, using a hands-on approach. Sessions are one hour and are offered weekly on Mondays at 2:00pm at our East Islip location.

Music Therapy unlocks emotion, unleashes joy and enhances wellbeing. Often, an appreciation and connection to music is of great value to people with Alzheimer's, as they lose communication capacity. ADRC's interactive Music Therapy Program enables people with Alzheimer's, and their caregivers, to revel in music's restorative power. Participants are invited to sing, dance and play along with hand-held percussion instruments. Sessions are one hour and are offered weekly on Tuesdays at 2:00pm at our East Islip location.

Equine Therapy is focused on people spending time "in the moment" with the horses, in a beautiful, natural setting. Participants are guided through gentle interactions, such as feeding and grooming. These activities promote connection to the accepting, friendly equine spirits. Horses are highly intuitive creatures, receptive to both verbal and non-verbal communication. ADRC's Equine Therapy Program runs one outing per month at a local horse rescue ranch. Transportation is not provided to and from the ranch. **Reservations for our Equine Program are required**.


