Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Second Year Anniversary

This December, we celebrate our 2nd year anniversary of having long extended hours of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every Tuesday, 12:30p.m. to 7:30pm. Each Tuesday I place the Holy Eucharist in a large container called Monstrance (*a word which means 'to-show'*) so everyone can visibly see the Eucharist. We have approximately 85 to 90 people who come throughout the day to sit in Adoration of the Lord.

Some may say, why do I have to go to adoration, I can stay home and pray. You can pray at home but here is what Bishop Robert Barron says about adoration in his series entitled **Catholicism, A Journey to the Heart of Faith**: "Adam, the first man, we hear walked in easy fellowship with God in the cool of the evening and spoke to Him as to a friend. This ordering of Adam to God meant that our first parent was effortlessly caught up in adoration. The term 'adoration' comes from the Latin adoratio, which in turn is derived from ad ora (to the mouth). To adore, therefore, is to be mouth to mouth with God, properly aligned to the divine source, breathing in God's life. When one is in the stance of adoration, the whole of one's life – mind, will, emotions, imagination, sexuality – becomes ordered and harmonized, much as the elements of a rose window arrange themselves musically around a central point." This happens when seated before the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration.

Some people come to the church and spend an hour in prayer. That is called a 'Holy-Hour'. Some stop in for 10, 20, or 30 minutes to connect with Jesus. "The only time our Lord asked the Apostles for anything was the night He went into agony. Not for activity did He plead but for an Hour of companionship." (Archbishop Fulton Sheen). What does one do during Adoration? Some sit in silence with the Lord, others do spiritual reading, pray the rosary, etc. Let the Lord inspire you as to what he wants you to do during Adoration.

I would like to thank Josephine O'Malley who helped me start the program two years ago by signing people up so we could have at least two people in the church every hour that the Holy Eucharist is exposed. Special thanks goes to Linda Weinstock for setting up the items for adoration and taking them down each week. I also want to thank all our Deacons who help in doing the benediction *(being blessed by the Eucharist)* at 7:30pm each week.

2024 Summer Pilgrimage with Fr. Tony Stanganelli and Fr. Charles Mangano:

In addition to Fr. Dennis Suglia, our Pastor, leading a parish pilgrimage to Israel in March 2024. Fr. Tony and I will be leading a parish pilgrimage to Medjugorje (former Yugoslavia, now Bosnia Hercegovina) August 12-20 and August 19-27, 2024. Choose which week is best for you. \$3,398.00 includes airfare, lodging, meals (breakfast and dinner), tour guide, bus, etc. Medjugorje means between the mountains. These mountains surround the village of Medjugorje. This is the place where the alleged apparitions of our Lady are occurring since 1981. We will be staying in the home of Ivan, the alleged visionary, and we will be present while he has the alleged apparition of our Lady each day. When the children asked our Lady the reason for her coming, her response was "My Son has sent me because we are concerned about your salvation." (The salvation of everyone). When they asked her, "Why did you choose Medjugorje?", her response was, "Because I have found faith here." Pilgrims come from all over the world, and seeing their strong faith empowers our soul with deeper faith, hope and love. We will experience adoration of the Blessed Sacrament outdoors under the stars along with thousands of other pilgrims. It is an experience of a lifetime. We will also have the opportunity to climb Apparition Hill while praying the rosary (the site of the first alleged apparition) and Cross Mountain as we pray the stations of the cross. For those who choose not to climb the mountains, they are free to gather in Ivan's chapel and pray the rosary and stations of the cross as a group. The love for Jesus and Mary is so evident in Medjugorje that it's palpable in the village. Medjugorje is a place where Heaven touches the earth especially through the sacraments and the faith of the people gathered. You will not only see and be in awe of the long lines of people going to confession, but you will also have the opportunity to go to the sacrament if you choose to do so. A pilgrimage is a microcosm of life. As a group we will pray together, learn more about our Lord's and our Lady's love for us, sing, laugh, relax and experience much more together. The alleged visionaries in Medjugorje tell us that no one goes to Medjugorje by accident. They are called individually by Our Lady. What an awesome thought!. Medjugorje Pilgrimage

Day-by-Day Itinerary

Day 1: Depart USA

Travel on the dates that work best for you: August 12-20, 2024 or August 19-27, 2024

Depart from New York, JFK or from your hometown for the overnight flight to Europe. Dinner and breakfast will be served on board.

Day 2: Arrive in Medjugorje

After an early morning arrival in Europe, you will connect flights to Dubrovnik (Split or Sarajevo). Upon arrival, you'll be greeted by a tour guide and/or driver who will then take you on the 2 1/2-hour drive by private coach to the village of Medjugorje. Here are some of the activities we'll be sharing with our fellow pilgrims: Each morning at 10:00 AM, we will assemble at St James Church for the English-language Mass (Feast days and Sundays English Mass is at 12:00 PM). Follow the path up Apparition Hill where the visionaries first encountered Our Lady. Touch and pray before the cross that commemorates the spot where Mary first appeared to the visionaries. Each evening at 6:00 PM, we will join the villagers and pilgrims to pray the rosary. The apparition takes place at 6:40 PM during daylight savings time, and then stay for the Croatian Mass. On Thursdays and Saturdays, we will partake in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and on Fridays, Veneration of the Cross in the Church. Each evening during the Croatian Mass, there is the Blessing of the Sick and blessing of the items you have with you. Our guide will arrange meetings with the visionaries at their own homes provided that they are in Medjugorje during your trip and pending their availability. We will have the opportunity to climb Krizevac Mountain, where in 1933 the villagers built a 30 foot high cross on the anniversary of Jesus' crucifixion. Visit and pray at "Blue Cross", which is a place of great healings and graces- a very special place at the base of Apparition Hill. We will also visit the Community of Cenacolo.

Day 9: Medjugorje - USA

After an early breakfast and heartfelt farewells, we leave by motor coach for Dubrovnik Airport (Split or Sarajevo) for return flights home.
