Pilgrimage to Auriesville, NY October 22, 2023

We just returned from the Shrine of the North American Martyrs in Auriesville, New York late last night. It was a great trip, a day filled with prayer and celebration as we participated and listened to opportunities for worship and a few talks.

We shared some highlights and graces on the bus trip home. For me, and several of the pilgrims, the highlight of the day was the mid-afternoon Eucharistic procession. Then, the Eucharist was carried outside of the Coliseum (the worship space) onto the grounds of the holy site. It seemed as if all the 7,500 attendees followed the procession around to different stations on the grounds. All the while, we were singing Eucharistic hymns and praying as we heard different Gospel passages proclaimed at different stations. Imagine the sight of thousands of people singing in unison as our Lord, disguised under the ordinary appearance of bread, led us on our journey.

Another highlight which took place just prior to the procession was "Praise and Adoration". This is where the Lord is exposed in a Monstrance (the Blessed Sacrament) much like we do here on Tuesday afternoons. In this case the "praise" portion was led by the Sisters of Life (<u>sistersoflife.org</u>) who sang very simple songs, many of which are composed by them, in order to cherish and honor our Lord's presence. Simply beautiful.

Special thanks to Father Charles for suggesting the idea and planning the event. To Deacon Rich for implementing the plan and to the Nam family, our beloved parishioners, of i-Delizia Deli for providing breakfast and comfort food for the journey upstate.
