Thanksgiving Day and the Memorial of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

This coming week is a very special week. Our entire nation will celebrate Thanksgiving Day on Thursday, November 23^{rd} - but before that, we the Catholic Church will celebrate the Memorial of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Tuesday, November 21^{st} – on the same week, just as we did last year. It won't be until 2028 and 2029 when this will happen again. It is special that they are celebrated the same week because Saints Anne and Joachim presented and consecrated Mary, their child, to the LORD to show their deep gratitude for the gift of their child even in their old age. Similarly, in the year 1621 the early Pilgrims of our nation celebrated the first Thanksgiving Day over dinner with some of their Native American guests to give thanks for the blessing and gift of their first harvest. Thus, we see the common theme of gratitude.

Many of us know about the customs and traditions of the annual national holiday: watching the Macy's Parade and the football games (traditionally featuring the Lions and the Cowboys as home teams) with family and friends on TV, and of course, let's not forget – the Thanksgiving dinner! But please allow me to present some facts and traditions related to the Memorial of the Presentation of our Blessed Mother.

This week's memorial of our dear Mother Mary finds its origin in the second century AD source called the "Protoevangelium of James." This ancient document along with Sacred Tradition suggest that Saints Anne and Joachim offered Mary to God when she was 3 years of age and remained in the temple after her Presentation. This means she dedicated herself in service to the temple and to whatever tasks she was assigned. It was a time of spiritual formation. She heard the word of God proclaimed, including the prophecies that would be fulfilled through her. Perhaps hearing the story of Hannah and Samuel resonated with her as she would later make Hannah's prayer inspire her own in the Magnificat. She also would have spent much time in personal prayer, living in the presence of the Holy of Holies only to receive the "All Holy One" within her very being at the Annunciation.

We Catholics can look back and see Mary's time in the temple, from the age of 3 to 12, as a time of advent and preparation. God called her to be there, and, in turn, she chose God. Because of this, God prepared her to receive the Savior of the world. The celebration of Mary's presentation in the temple is an anticipation of the Advent we commence around the time of this feast (Advent begins on December 3rd this year). Throughout the holy season of Advent, with Mary we can listen to prophecies, we can watch and pray for the coming of the "Dawn from on high." Each day is an opportunity for us to renew and recommit ourselves to the Lord's service, just as Mary did in the temple.

In celebrating her feast, we should not be overly concerned with the historical details of Mary's Presentation. The tradition of its observance must simply be a reminder to us that Mary lived her life for God, and that we should, too. In her life, we find an example of how to live our own. She is the model of the entire Church. And so brothers and sisters, in the busyness of our Thanksgiving Day preparations and as we celebrate the national holiday this week, let us all be mindful of the importance of the Blessed Virgin Mary's role in salvation history: our own hope of eternal life with God through the redemptive work of her Son, our Savior - Jesus Christ... *To Jesus through Mary!... A Happy, Blessed Thanksgiving Day to all of you!*



El Salvador Mission Trip








Boy Scout Troop 179

2024 Spring Bible Study "A Biblical Walk Through the Mass"

We are advertising early for our next Bible Study because it fills up very quickly and we want to give our parishioners who go away for the winter months a chance to sign-up before they leave.


This next study is entitled *A Biblical Walk Through the Mass*. This will help us to see where the elements of the Mass are rooted in the bible. A Biblical Walk Through the Mass is a scriptural tour through the prayers, hymns, and rituals of the Liturgy. Practically every part of the Mass finds its inspiration in Scripture, as Pope Benedict XVI has noted. Therefore, the more we understand the biblical background to the *Kyrie*, the *Gloria*, and other prayers of the Liturgy, the more we will be able to enter into all that we say and do in the Mass.

After providing a general overview of the Liturgy, this study devotes a session to each of the major sections of the Mass: **the Introductory Rites**, **the Liturgy of the Word**, **the Liturgy of the Eucharist**, **and the Concluding Rites**. Between each class, readings from the Bible, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) will be given to participants for their review. This is to deepen their understanding of the prayers and other elements of the Mass. During this study each person will receive a workbook and text book by Dr. Edward Sri which is based on the 2011 translation of the Mass.

The Study will be six consecutive Tuesdays: April 30, May 7th, 14th, 21st, 28th, June 4th. There will be a DVD presentation by Dr. Edward Sri each week and group facilitators will be assisting our weekly discussion. The last session will be a Mass and hospitality. There will be two sessions each Tuesday, 1:00pm (*limited to 116 people*) and 7:30pm (*limited to 184 people*). You can sign up for whichever session is most convenient for you.

The cost of the bible study is \$30.00 per person to cover the cost of the books and supplies. If you cannot afford that amount, feel free to give whatever you can afford. Please don't let the cost keep you away.






