### **Advent-A Time to Slow Down and Focus**

Advent is a time of waiting and hope. It is a time to stop, listen and refocus our lives on Jesus. A time to pay attention to what is going on around us and what is going on within us. Matthew Kelly, a Catholic author and speaker, states that "we from time-to-time, need to step back and look at what we are doing. We must check our connection because when we get disconnected from God, we get disconnected from ourselves".

In our fast-paced society, it is difficult to enter a state of peacefulness and silence so we can hear God's voice. In a Newsday article that appeared on Friday December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, under the heading "Survey: Drivers admit to dangerous or distracted driving", 60% of drivers in an anonymous national survey done by AAA said they engaged in risky behavior including speeding, driving aggressively, distracted driving which included texting behind the wheel, or driving impaired. It went on to say that 36% of fatal crashes in New York were speed-related in 2021, but fewer drivers in the study considered speeding as dangerous behavior. Most, if not all of us, have had the experience of seeing a car speed past us only to find them sitting beside us at the next red traffic light. Although speeding is counterproductive in so many ways, we still seem to not be able to slow down, even if it risks the lives of ourselves and others around us.

Fr. Ron Rolheiser, an author and speaker, wrote an article about Advent titled, "Advent-A time to learn how to wait". In this article, he related a story shared by Annie Dillard, an American author, about the benefits and necessity to wait. Ms. Dillard described how she had been watching a butterfly emerge from its cocoon and was fascinated by the process until she grew impatient with how long it was taking. To speed things up, she took a candle and heated the cocoon very gently. The experiment worked, but it was a mistake in the long run. The butterfly emerged more quickly; however, because adding heat violated something within the natural process, the butterfly was born with wings too weak to fly. Haste and prematurity had stunted and deformed a natural process.

In three out of four Sundays in Advent, our first reading comes from the Prophet Isaiah for good reason. Isaiah reminds us that Advent is a Penitential time. We are reminded that we, like Israel, wander and grow distant from God. By quieting ourselves, being prayerful, hopeful and vigilant during Advent, it is an opportunity to hear God welcoming and calling us back into relationship with Him. The prophet Isaiah reminds us that God wants to comfort us and offers us a new beginning. Advent is also a season of joy because of God's graciousness and new life that He offers us. As Fr. Victor Cancino, a Jesuit priest who writes for America Media says, "Advent is a time to awaken the soul of anticipation. It is a time to pay attention and focus ourselves as we move slowly towards the mystery of incarnation".

The first two weeks of the Advent season focuses our attention on Christ's second coming at the end of time. The last two weeks reminds us of the birth of Jesus on Christmas. The entire season is a time to step back from our busyness to focus on God's presence in our lives. It is a time to reflect on what God is asking of us. To do this, we need to slow down, pray and most of all, listen. To take advantage of the gift of the season, we need to celebrate Advent before we celebrate Christmas. Yes, this is a challenge for us because of the fast-paced consumer-oriented society we live in. It is up to us, with God's help, to carve out space for this. As Sister Barbara Reid, a Dominican nun and scripture scholar reminds us, "this is not the time to solve the mystery of God, rather it is simply a time to dwell in God's mystery".





#### Dear Parishioners:

Greetings from Smithtown! I arrived home on Saturday, Oct 21. Fr. Dennis graciously allowed me to stay at OLL and I arrived at St. Patrick on Nov 1. When I left Kuwait, it was still hot (but only 105 degrees); after 2 months of 120 degrees, it seemed almost cool! But it was still very windy.

I just wanted to thank you for your incredible generosity in responding to my request for Care Packages for the troops. The Parish sent 187 Care Packages! Since the Care Packages were addressed to me, the Post Office wanted to know who this "Ch Brian McNamara" was and where were all these boxes coming from!

We have about 1,400 Air Force Service Members, as well as a small group of Army soldiers and a very small group of Navy and Marines. In addition, we have almost 600 Italian troops, plus, Canadian troops, and even Danish troops (who knew they had an Air Force!). Your "Care Packages" go a long way in helping morale. Many of the troops work 12-hour shifts, 6 days a week. So, Care Packages are a great morale booster!

We just had a joint coalition Mass here at the Chapel: American, Italian, and Canadian troops. The Italian troops brought their own choir, and we had readings in English and Italian. Interestingly enough, the Catholic Canadian chaplain is not a priest; he is a layperson with an advanced degree in theology. In the USA and in Italy, this would never be allowed. Only a priest, because they can perform the sacraments, can be a chaplain. In the Italian military, in fact, only priests can be chaplains; they do not have Protestant or Muslim chaplains – only Catholic priests.

In addition, before I left, we also had a Coalition concert which was very well attended: hymns in English, Italian and even a French hymn (thank you, Canadians!). They are planning a Christmas concert in December.

I flew to Iraq a few times to celebrate Mass. One of the bases I went to has been in the news because it has suffered a number of drone attacks but, thankfully, only minor injuries. I went before the war broke out, so it was relatively peaceful and safe. I was also on the compound in Bagdad which was very heavily watched and guarded.

I met the Vatican Ambassador to Kuwait, Bahrain, and the United Arab Emirates. He is from Ireland, Archbishop Eugene Nugent.

As you my recall, the base was "fixing" the pool. The pool was not fixed before I left! It was supposed to be done by mid-August, but major complications developed.


In addition to thanking you for your generosity, I also wanted to highlight a few other "thank you's." I wanted to thank **Ann R.**, **Ann Munkewitz and Gloria Monaco**. They were the "Holy Trinity" who did a fantastic job of assembling a small army of volunteers to put all the materials and to put the donated items into the proper size boxes for shipping. That was a very long, time-consuming task. The packing was assisted by Boy Scouts Troop 179 and Troop 1 from Babylon. The LAOH division 2 also helped with the packing. It was truly a team effort. Ann R's friend, Jerry, also helped transport everything to the Post Office.

In addition, financial donations came from: The Manley Family, Ancient Order of Hibernians (AOH) & the Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians (LAOH) Babylon Division 2, AOH & LAOH Suffolk County, LAOH Division 8 & 9, LAOH Division 3, Chris Jensen, Pamela Griffin Hansen, Meg McConnell, Gerry Belmont, and Bill Reilly. The AOH is a great fraternal and charitable organization; I encourage anyone of Irish ancestry to consider joining these great group of men and women.

Also, I would like to thank the Knights of Columbus (our parish), American Legion West Islip, Chapey Funeral Home & Angie Carpenter. They are always so generous to our Parish, and they were generous to our troops as well. They are the best!

Thank you again for all your generosity and your prayers for me and the troops.

# 2024 Spring Bible Study "A Biblical Walk Through the Mass"

We are advertising early for our next Bible Study because it fills up very quickly and we want to give our parishioners who go away for the winter months a chance to sign-up before they leave.

This next study is entitled *A Biblical Walk Through the Mass*. This will help us to see where the elements of the Mass are rooted in the bible. A Biblical Walk Through the Mass is a scriptural tour through the prayers, hymns, and rituals of the Liturgy. Practically every part of the Mass finds its inspiration in Scripture, as Pope Benedict XVI has noted. Therefore, the more we understand the biblical background to the *Kyrie*, the *Gloria*, and other prayers of the Liturgy, the more we will be able to enter into all that we say and do in the Mass.

After providing a general overview of the Liturgy, this study devotes a session to each of the major sections of the Mass: **the Introductory Rites**, **the Liturgy of the Word**, **the Liturgy of the Eucharist**, **and the Concluding Rites**. Between each class, readings from the Bible, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) will be given to participants for their review. This is to deepen their understanding of the prayers and other elements of the Mass. During this study each person will receive a workbook and text book by Dr. Edward Sri which is based on the 2011 translation of the Mass.

The Study will be six consecutive Tuesdays: April 30, May 7, 14, 21, 28, June 4. There will be a DVD presentation by Dr. Edward Sri each week and group facilitators will be assisting our weekly discussion. The last session will be a Mass and hospitality. There will be two sessions each Tuesday, 1:00pm (*limited to 116 people*) and 7:30pm (*limited to 184 people*). You can sign up for whichever session is most convenient. The cost of the bible study is \$ 30.00 per person to cover the cost of the books and supplies. If you cannot afford that amount, feel free to give whatever you can afford. 
Butterfly Memory Café - December 15, 2023 from 1:30pm-2:30pm






