How Does God See Us?

Recently, I came across an article in *Our Sunday Visitor*, written by David Mills. The title captured my attention immediately, "Learning to be our true selves as God sees us, not who the world tells us to be." Mr. Mills starts by retelling the story of Adam and Eve. Everything was going well in the Garden of Eden. Adam and Eve seem delighted with God and God, for His part loved, Adam and Eve dearly. Afterall, they were made in the image and likeness of God. What could be better?

Adam and Eve's only restriction was they could not eat the fruit of the tree of knowledge. We all know how the story turns out. Sin came into the world, original sin. The writer jumps in time to our present day. His premise is that our world does not represent God's will. Mr. Mills makes a compelling argument that our world is driven by consumer desires. Think for a moment how many times in the day do we see advertisements or commercials telling us if we buy certain products, we will look better, feel better and find ourselves totally contented. Not to mention that there will be something soon to replace what we use to make us happy.

As a college student, I remember reading a book by Sigmund Freud; its title was *Civilization and Its Discontent*. While not a fan of Freud's, this book was compelling in its reasoning. The major premise was that the more civilized we are, the more discontented we become. We can have all the amenities, and still desire more. Our western world tells us not to be satisfied with the basics because we deserve the best. With that mentality, we neglect the real sin of avarice or greed. Our temptations or desires outweigh our real needs.

How do we distinguish between a desire and a need? If we take the world view, we might convince ourselves that our desires are our needs. When I look back at my parents' generation, the terms might have had different meanings. My father was a hard worker; I cannot remember a time he did not work two jobs to provide for our family. My mother was a domestic engineer, a housewife was how they historically referred to women who stayed at home.

There was always food on the table, and if we did not like what was being served, we could go to bed without supper. Mom had a favorite big pot to cook. We never knew if we were having spaghetti, soup, mashed potatoes, or anything else she would cook in the pot, but we never went hungry. One time mom was cooking something in the pot, and I asked her what it was, and she said corned beef. It turned out it was cow's tongue. To this day, I do not eat corned beef, not even on St. Patrick's Day. Their desires were simple; they wanted the best for their kids and were willing to sacrifice to try and fulfill their desires. As children, we knew what was expected of us; my parents made sure to remind us often.

So, how does God see us? He sees us as His loving creation, God wants to have a relationship with us, even when we sometimes turn away from Him or when we sin. God's mercy knows no bounds, it is there for the asking. He wants what is best for us. Our readings for this week warn us to be ready. In the first reading, we see Jonah doing a lackluster job of preaching and turning the citizens of Nineveh away from sin. Yet, they did repent, and God's mercy was upon them; they were not destroyed. St. Paul warns the Corinthians that time was running out. As Maria Enid Barga points out in her reflection, "We are called to live in the "now" with the end in mind." The right emphasis on what is important is exemplified in Mark's Gospel, where we are given examples of those whose connection to earthly things is second to their relationship to God which is of the utmost importance.

Some may be thinking that all sounds good, but how do I achieve that desired relationship with our God? As I have mentioned before, I too am a work in progress, a sinner if you will, but my desire is to be pleasing in God's sight. There's work to be done, God is watching. Like that old song says, "I want to be in that number, when the saints come marching in."

The Kitchen relies heavily on its generous volunteer support and, as such, **numerous on-site and off-site volunteer opportunities are now available.** While there are openings for on-site positions, such as helping to prepare and serve meals and to perform various maintenance functions, there are also openings for diverse off-site positions in areas such as finance, grant development and preparation, legal compliance assurance, marketing duties, social media facilitation and fund raising/donation coordination.




