Have you seen the risen Lord?

After Jesus' resurrection, His disciples were downcast. In fact, they were fearful that what happened to Jesus would happen to them. Their world had ended as far as they were concerned. Why? Because they did not recognize Jesus in His many appearances after His resurrection that were recorded in the Gospel. This included Mary Magdalene when Jesus appeared as a gardener. Or on the Road to Emmaus, when Jesus appeared as a traveler to the disciples. Whatever the disciples were looking for or maybe because they were so overwhelmed by fear, they missed the opportunity to recognize Jesus in their encounters with Him.

St. Paul said that "if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain... If for this life we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied" (1 Cor 15:14, 19). The fact is that if Jesus did not rise from the dead, our faith would be dead.

In our world today we see conflict with the wars in the Middle East, Ukraine and in other parts of the world. We see the suffering of innocent people and the terrible starvation in Gazza, Africa and in Haiti. So many of us are also suffering in our own lives with illness, problems with families, addictions, financial issues and struggles with our faith. Are we any different than the disciples? Isn't it just as hard for us at times to see the risen Lord, the Son of the loving, compassionate God who sent His Son into the world to bring us peace and salvation?

Fr. Ron Rolheiser, a well-known speaker and author, wrote an article on April 9, 2018, "Reasons to Believe in God". These are some of the highlights of that article:

- I believe in God because I sense, at the deepest level of my being, that there's an inalienable moral structure to things. Life, love, and meaning.
- I believe in God because blind chaos could not have designed things this way, to be innately moral. Only an intelligent goodness could have built reality this way.
- I believe in God because in God is the existence of soul, intelligence and love. These could not have emerged simply from blind chaos.
- I believe in God because of the existence of families of faith and the existence of church and sacrament.
- I believe in God because the Gospel works- as prayer does if we work it.

Today, like the disciples, people are searching for hope and healing. They are seeking an encounter with the Risen Lord. The disciples experienced this through a personal encounter with the glorified Lord. Because of this encounter, their world changed forever. We encounter Jesus through prayer, the sacraments, through our community of believers (church) and through each other. Resurrection happens every time we love someone. It happens every time we refuse to give up hope and selflessly allow Christ to work through us for the sake of others.

In Matthew's Gospel, the disciples asked Jesus, "Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink. When did we see You a stranger and welcome You, or naked and clothe You? When did we see You ill or in prison, and visit You? And the King will say to them in reply, "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of Mine, you did for Me."

Where is the risen Lord? He is right here, right in front of you, right now.



Are you familiar with the Divine Mercy of Jesus? On February 22, 1931, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ appeared to a nun by the name of Sister Maria Faustina Kowalska. She was from the Congregation of Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in Cracow, Poland. Jesus appeared to her bringing with him a wonderful message of Mercy for all people. In the apparition, she saw Jesus standing before her in a white robe. With his left hand he was pulling back his garment revealing his heart, out of which came white and red rays (symbolic of the blood and water which flowed from his side when pierced with a lance on the cross. This image reminds us of the tender Mercy of God which was shed upon the world at Calvary). This image of Jesus as he appeared to St. Faustina can be seen hanging on the back wall of the church behind the last pew.

It is in the heart of Jesus that we find love, mercy, strength, hope and healing. Jesus said to St. Faustina, "the greater the sinner, the greater their right to my mercy." No matter what sin one commits, if their heart is truly repentant, God will forgive them.

Sr. Faustina's spiritual director, who was a priest, commissioned her to write down everything in a journal that Jesus said and did during her visions. Saint Faustina died at the age of 33 leaving her journal to her spiritual director. He gave the journal to the Marians of the Immaculate Conception in Stockbridge, Massachusetts. Therefore, that is why the National Shrine of the Divine Mercy is located there. In the year 2000, Pope Saint John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina a saint, making this apparition worthy of belief.

Local Resurgence of Pastor Impersonation Scams If you receive an email or text like this:

I have an assignment I need you to do for me immediately. Let me know if you are available. so kindly respond back via email.

it is <u>NOT</u> from Fr. Dennis!

There has been a recent resurgence of scammers posing as pastors, priests, rabbis and rectors. The impostors cajole unsuspecting congregants into spending hundreds of dollars on gift cards, supposedly for people in need, then abscond with the loot. Believed to be a growing problem, clergy scams occur across faith groups and across the country. Catholic, Christian, Protestant, Jewish, Buddhist and Muslim congregations have all been besieged by scammers.

Please read the information below to help protect yourself from scams and hackers.

Tips for Spotting a Scam. Don't fall for it! Here's what to know and do:

- First, Fr. Dennis or Fr. Charles will <u>never</u> contact a parishioner directly with an emergency request for cash, assistance, or gift cards. Messages asking parishioners to help fulfill a need would come through the parish's official communication channels or be accomplished through a collection approved by the diocese. If you're not sure about a text or email you've received, do not engage or respond. Call the Parish Office right away to notify a staff member. In addition, please note that neither your parish, nor the diocese, will ever sell or give away parishioners' personal information.
- Often times with text messages, a scam can be identified by looking at the phone number. If the area code is not local, it's likely a scam. If you are contacted by a scammer, report it to the Parish Office. If you can, capture screen shots of the correspondence on your phone or laptop and email those to the Parish Office.
- File a report through the Federal Trade Commission's Complaint Assistant which helps the FTC detect patterns of fraud and abuse.
- If you suspect that your Facebook account has been hacked, CBS News offers these tips on how to tell if your account's been hacked and what to do about it at: <u>https://www.cbsnews.com/news/how-to-tell-if-your -facebook-has-been-hacked-and-what-you-can-do/</u>. You can also check the "help center" on Facebook for information on hacked and fake (cloned) accounts.

Be on the lookout when someone:

Pretends to be someone you know.

Scammers often pretend to be contacting you from the IRS or Social Security Administration, or from a company you're familiar with like your bank. They might make up a name that sounds official, or say they're calling on behalf of a loved one.

Presents you with a conditional prize or problem.

Scammers may say you've won a prize that's too good to be true, and you have to pay a fee in order to receive it. They might say you're in trouble with the government, or a family member is in trouble and needs money.

Pressures you to act immediately.

Scammers want you to act before you have time to think. They may say a family member has an emergency or your computer has a virus. Sometimes they threaten legal action, arrest or to freeze your bank account.

Asks you to pay in a specific manner.

Scammers will often insist you pay by sending money through a payment app, wire transfer or by putting money on a gift card and then reading them the number on the back. Some will send you a fake check, ask you to deposit it and then ask you to send them the money.

- A \$1000 Community Service Award is available for a student performing exceptional Community Service. An applicant must be between 14 years old and 21 years old.

Requirements for the Knights of Columbus Scholarship

Scholarships and Awards are awarded based on the character of the individual and their involvement in the Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Catholic Church and participation in community activities. The decision of the Scholarship and Award Committee is final and only winners will be notified.






2024 Spring Bible Study "A Biblical Walk Through the Mass"

This next study is entitled *A Biblical Walk Through the Mass.* This will help us to see where the elements of the Mass are rooted in the bible. A Biblical Walk Through the Mass is a scriptural tour through the prayers, hymns, and rituals of the Liturgy. Practically every part of the Mass finds its inspiration in Scripture, as Pope Benedict XVI has noted. Therefore, the more we understand the biblical background to the *Kyrie*, the *Gloria*, and other prayers of the Liturgy, the more we will be able to enter into all that we say and do in the Mass.

After providing a general overview of the Liturgy, this study devotes a session to each of the major sections of the Mass: **the Introductory Rites**, **the Liturgy of the Word**, **the Liturgy of the Eucharist**, **and the Concluding Rites**. Between each class, readings from the Bible, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) will be given to participants for their review. This is to deepen their understanding of the prayers and other elements of the Mass. During this study each person will receive a workbook and text book by Dr. Edward Sri which is based on the 2011 translation of the Mass.

The Study will be six consecutive Tuesdays: April 30, May 7, 14, 21, 28, June 4. There will be a DVD presentation by Dr. Edward Sri each week and group facilitators will be assisting our weekly discussion. The last session will be a Mass and hospitality. There will be two sessions each Tuesday, 1:00pm *(limited to 116 people)* and 7:30pm *(limited to 184 people)*. You can sign up for whichever session is most convenient. The cost of the bible study is \$30.00 per person to cover the cost of the books and supplies. If you cannot afford that amount, feel free to give whatever you can afford. 
