

Midsummer Time and the Bread of Life Discourse

One of the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council was to increase the amount of the Scriptures proclaimed at Mass. Before Vatican II, there was only one set of readings for Sundays and holy days so the treasures of the Bible were not tapped into more fully. So, at the direction of the Council, a 3-year cycle was created and the readings for each of the years (A, B, and C) were selected. The Gospels proclaimed are largely assigned to a specific year: Matthew in Year A, Mark in Year B, and Luke in Year C. John's Gospel is used each year on major feast days, for the Lenten Scrutinies, throughout the Easter season, and in one other significant time in the 3-year cycle - The Bread of Life Discourse in Year B usually around the middle of summer (late July and August).

We are in Year B and, since our return to Ordinary Time back in May, we have heard from the Gospel of Mark. However, in the next five weeks, we will hear nearly the entirety of John Chapter 6. This famous chapter, of which we are all familiar, is where Jesus says he is the bread of life, thus the discourse name. It is full of typology referencing the Eucharist. It is from this chapter that the Church draws much of her Eucharistic theology most especially our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

From Chapter 6, we will hear verses 1–15 on Sunday (July 28), then verses 24–35 on August 4th, and verses 41-51 on August 11. We will continue with verses 51-58 on August 18 and conclude with reading verses 60–69 on August 25, a week before Labor Day weekend. We then return to reading from Mark's Gospel.

With the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis concluding this weekend (July 20/21), I encourage you to keep your focus on these readings for the coming Sundays and maybe, on your own time, read and reflect on the Bread of Life Discourse in Saint John's Gospel. Perhaps it can be a way we can keep the spirit of the National Eucharistic Revival Movement alive in our hearts and shared with others.

Below is a sneak preview of the readings for the next five Sundays:

<u>07/28/24, 17th Sunday - John 6:1-15:</u> Jesus multiplies the 5 barley loaves and two fish and feeds the five thousand. It symbolizes the food that is readily available through Jesus.

<u>08/04/24</u>, <u>18th Sunday - John 6:24-35</u>: The crowd follows Jesus to Capernaum because he fed them (he met their bodily needs). Jesus tells them to work for the "food that endures for eternal life." He tells them that it was not Moses who gave their ancestors bread, but his Father in heaven.

<u>08/11/24, 19th Sunday - John 6:41-51:</u> Jesus tells the crowd to "stop murmuring" regarding him saying he is "the bread come down from heaven" similar to the Israelites murmuring against Moses and God in the desert. Jesus again says he is the bread of life and the "bread [he] will give is [his] flesh for the life of the world."

<u>08/18/24, 20th Sunday - John 6:51-58:</u> Jesus doubles down on his claim to be the bread of life and that we must eat his flesh and drink his blood to have eternal life.

<u>08/25/24, 21st Sunday - John 6:60-69:</u> Many of the disciples following him said that his teaching was "hard", and they asked, "who can accept it?" Jesus says his words are "spirit and life." As a result, many were scandalized at this teaching and many began to leave. Jesus asks the Twelve if they wish to leave as well. To which Peter answers, "Master, to whom shall we go? ... You have the words of eternal life... You are the Holy One of God."

Through this discourse, may we come to a deeper knowledge of **Jesus: The Bread of Life**, and make Peter's great profession of faith our own! Have a safe, fun time for the rest of the summer season!





Our Next Bible Study



Exciting news: this fall, we will be having another bible study entitled, "Eucharist" by **Bishop Robert Barron**. He is 64 years old and has been a Bishop for the past nine years. He was appointed the Ordinary of the Diocese of Winona–Rochester in 2022 where he presently resides. He is the founder of the Catholic ministerial organization *Word on Fire*, and was the host of *Catholicism*, a documentary TV series about Catholicism that aired on PBS. He is extremely gifted in his ability to explain the Catholic faith in clear, understandable and inspiring ways.


This bible study will be a six-week series. The dates are Tuesdays, September 17, 24, October 1, 8, 15 and 22. There will be a 1:00pm session in the Parish Center and a 7:30pm session in the All Purpose Room. Each week, we will view a video and have small group discussions based on the Study Guide questions. The answers to all questions are in the workbook. Because the bible study starts in mid-September, all the books and supplies

need to be ordered over the summer. Therefore, please call the parish office today to register at 631-661-3224 ext. 2. There will be a free-will offering to help defray the cost of study. When you call the rectory to register, please inform the secretary if you are open to being a facilitator.

Because we are still in the Year of the Holy Eucharist, proclaimed by Pope Francis, we thought focusing on the Eucharist would be most appropriate. While the topic of the Eucharist was addressed in the last bible study, this new study will focus solely on the Eucharist, going more in depth.

Did you know that more than half of current Catholics do not know the Church's teaching on the "real presence of Christ" in the Eucharist? Statistics show that more than 70% of Catholics do not believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. While the Eucharist is an ineffable mystery, Vatican II called the Eucharist the "source and summit of the Christian life." With this new bible study, we will delve into the mystery of Christ's presence in our lives, and the centrality of the Eucharist as an important part of that presence. This fresh look at the Eucharist brings to light its reality as sacred meal, the sacrifice necessary for communion with God, and the Real Presence of Christ This is foreshadowed in many parts of the Old Testament, the once-and-for-all sacrifice that reunited humanity with God, and the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ, present through transubstantiation.

I hope you will be able to join us for this most beautiful bible study. Each week will be live streamed and archived on our parish website so, if you miss a week, you can still view the video.
