

## The 2024 Summer Olympics

It has been two weeks since the 2024 Olympics in Paris officially closed. Before you know it, we will be preparing for the 2028 summer Olympics in Los Angeles. Prior to that, it seems to be a good time to look back on the 2024 games that just ended.

206 countries were represented in the 2024 Paris Olympics. The 2024 games featured 329 medal events, the second most in the history of the games (there were 339 at the 2020 Tokyo summer Olympics). Of the 206 countries that participated in the games, 54 were from Africa, 48 from Europe, 44 from Asia, 41 from the Americas and 17 from Oceania. Russian athletes were banned from performing this year after invading Ukraine although "individual neutral athletes were allowed to participate". Only 15 Russian athletes competed.

The Olympic Games started around 3,000 years ago, around 776 BC. No one really knows the purpose of the origin of the Olympics. Today, the IOC's mission and vision statement (International Olympic Committee) states the purpose of the Olympics is to "build a better world through sport". The values include "Excellence, Respect and Friendship". The working principles include "Solidarity and unity in Diversity".

Keeping in mind the "spirit" of the Olympics, it seems ironic and unimaginable that this year's opening ceremony in Paris included what many church leaders and politicians called a "mockery of Christianity." According to a NY Times article published July 28<sup>th</sup>, many condemned the performance from the opening ceremony as a Parody of the Last Supper. The organizers denied that the scene was inspired by "The Last Supper" although the evidence was quite clear. The condemnation included the French Catholic Bishops' Conference as well as the American influential Bishop of Minnesota, Bishop Robert Barron. According to the French Bishops, the opening ceremony included "scenes of mockery and derision of Christianity." Bishop Barron called it a "gross mockery." He further questioned why France would permit a central moment of our faith, when Jesus gives His body and blood in anticipation of His death on the cross, to be mocked in this way. He than asks the question, "would they ever have dared to mock Islam or a scene from the Quran in a similar way"? He further states "we all know the answer, in our secular society, they know who the enemy is," meaning we as Catholics are the enemy. Bishop Barron concludes by encouraging Catholics and other Christians not to be "sheepish." We should make our voices heard.

Despite Rule 50 of the IOC Athletes' Commission which bans any kind of demonstration or political, religious, or racial propaganda at all Olympic venues (including on the field of play) three top American athletes who are either Catholic or attended Catholic schools, thanked God for their gifts and for their success. These three athletes, who all won the gold medal include, Katie Ledecky (swimmer) who is devoted to the Blessed Mother, Sydney McLoughlin-Levrone (track and field) who often references scripture and Simone Biles (gymnast) who speaks about attending Mass and seeks the intercession of St. Sebastian, the patron saint for athletes. There were many other athletes who also displayed their faith, on the field and in interviews, by what they said and by other displays of faith. In the year of the Eucharistic revival, these athletes are a shining example of those who are not afraid to spread the Eucharistic message that God is with us.

As a side note, Father Joseph Fitzgerald, was one of 40 chaplains present at the Olympics, for Mass and to offer counsel. He is a former Olympian, grew up in North Babylon and is now the pastor of St. William the Abbot Church in Seaford. He wanted the following message to be the takeaway for the athletes: "The ultimate race is this relationship...being present and sitting with the Lord, knowing that you're a beloved daughter and son of God whether you win gold or finish in last place." I would add that it is not only for us to realize God's love through the Eucharist, but also to allow God to work through our lives to let others know that God loves them as well.



# **Our Next Bible Study**



Exciting news: this fall, we will be having another bible study entitled, "Eucharist" by Bishop Robert Barron. He is 64 years old and has been a Bishop for the past nine years. He was appointed the Ordinary of the Diocese of Winona–Rochester in 2022 where he presently resides. He is the founder of the Catholic ministerial organization *Word on Fire,* and was the host of *Catholicism*, a documentary TV series about Catholicism that aired on PBS. He is extremely gifted in his ability to explain the Catholic faith in clear, understandable and inspiring ways.

This bible study will be a six-week series. The dates are Tuesdays, September 17, 24, October 1, 8, 15 and 22. There will be a 1:00pm session in the Parish Center and a 7:30pm session in the All Purpose Room. Each week, we will view a video and have small group discussions based on the Study Guide questions. The answers to all questions are in the workbook. Because the bible study starts in mid-September, all the books and supplies

need to be ordered over the summer. Therefore, **please call the parish office today to register at 631-661-3224 ext. 2, or sign up using the QR Code listed below.** There will be a free-will offering to help defray the cost of study. If you are open to being a facilitator, please advise the receptionist when you register. Because we are still in the Year of the Holy Eucharist, proclaimed by Pope Francis, we thought focusing on the Eucharist would be most appropriate. While the topic of the Eucharist was addressed in the last bible study, this new study will focus solely on the Eucharist, going more in depth.

Did you know that more than half of current Catholics do not know the Church's teaching on the "real presence of Christ" in the Eucharist? Statistics show that more than 70% of Catholics do not believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. While the Eucharist is an ineffable mystery, Vatican II called the Eucharist the "source and summit of the Christian life." With this new bible study, we will delve into the mystery of Christ's presence in our lives, and the centrality of the Eucharist as an important part of that presence. This fresh look at the Eucharist brings to light its reality as sacred meal, the sacrifice necessary for communion with God, and the Real Presence of Christ This is foreshadowed in many parts of the Old Testament, the once-and-for-all sacrifice that reunited humanity with God, and the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ, present through transubstantiation.

I hope you will be able to join us for this most beautiful bible study. Each week will be live streamed and archived on our parish website so, if you miss a week, you can still view the video.

Note: If you already have a Virtus account (<u>www.Virtus.org</u>), have signed the Code of Conduct and attended the Class, all you need to do is initiate the updated background screening through Sterling Volunteers.

#### **Requirements are as follows:**

- 1. Attend a Virtus: Protecting God's Children class.
- 2. Undergo background screening.
- 3. Sign the Diocesan Code of Conduct.

#### Instructions to Complete the Safe Environment Requirements:

- Log into the Virtus website: <u>www.Virtus.org</u>.
- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.






