People Who Sing Pray Twice

Recently, I read an article by Cardinal Timothy Dolan in the publication *Our Sunday Visitor*. At first glance, I was drawn in by the title of the article, "People who sing pray twice." Cardinal Dolan is gregarious by nature, and often shows a good sense of humor is his delivery. He starts off the column by telling the reader he likes "bulletin bloopers." One he shared made me laugh; "What will hell be like? Come early and listen to the choir."

Cardinal Dolan is not poking fun of church choirs, in fact, he speaks highly of the choir from St. Patrick's Cathedral. He relates how towards the end of the Second Vatican Council, there was an emphasis on congregational singing, and the development of excellent parish choirs. Despite the emphasis, there still seems to be plenty of criticism towards church choirs. Cardinal Dolan acknowledges that some of the comments merit further review. One such example is that at times choirs can overshadow the singing of the congregation. He continues, choirs should enhance the congregational singing, not replace it.

I remember one of my first teaching jobs in a catholic school, I was friends with the music teacher. I wasn't sure if it was because he was the only other male on staff or listening to his interesting life experiences. On one occasion, I happened to be walking through the music wing of the school, and I heard the loudest singing I have ever encountered. I noticed though that there seemed to be one voice terribly off key. I stopped at the room and looked in. Lo and behold the voice belonged to the music teacher.

At lunch that day, I asked him what made him go into music. He told me he loved instruments, musicals and singing. I said about that last point, Bob (not his real name), your voice is unique. He smiled and said, "you mean awful." I did not want to offend him, but I looked at him and shrugged. Listen he said, "I love my faith, and I truly believe when you sing in church, you pray twice." By the way he said, did you notice how loud my students were singing the hymns. "Of course, I said, as I was walking towards the music wing, the loud music caught my attention." Bob smiled and said, "At first the students were shy and reluctant to sing; then I told them I am not bothered that my voice is not even close to good, but that when I sing hymns, I am praying twice."

He went on further to tell his students that "God does not care that all voices aren't beautiful, rather that you raise your voices in praise and glory of Him." His point echoed in this article where it stated, "People who sing with the proper attitude at Mass elevate our worship, point to the Eucharist."

By the way, this event I am recounting happened over forty years ago. I still think of that day as one that taught me a valuable lesson; sing with joy and gratitude to a God who loves us, whether we sing well or a little off key like Bob.

Sacred Heart Banner

I am writing to you to discuss the environment in the Church. You may have seen our new beautiful Tabernacle, which was donated by an anonymous person, centered in our sanctuary. What a beautiful receptacle to reserve Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

I believe Fr. Brian moved the Tabernacle to the center of our worship space some time ago. This is the proper place for Jesus, Our Lord, truly present in his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Blessed Sacrament. Centering the Blessed Sacrament in our worship space is what the Church calls for and teaches.

When the Tabernacle was moved to the center of the worship space, it left somewhat of a void in the previous location where the Tabernacle used to reside, in the southernmost part of the Church. We removed that now empty Tabernacle around Holy Week because it was redundant and could also be misleading to worshippers who may have thought that it was still in use. That provided us with an opportunity to enhance our worship space in this former sanctuary.

Most recently, in June we placed an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in this place. June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. What an appropriate way to honor Our Lord by having this image decorate our worship space. The placement of this image was meant to be temporary, but it has become so popular we have kept it up standing for a time.

With October approaching fast, this month dedicated to the Rosary we will be putting up a new image for the month: an image of Our Lady of Lourdes and Saint Bernadette. While I know some of you will be sad to see the Sacred Heart image taken down, you need not worry, it will be back in November. Then, in December, we have Advent and Christmastime approaching so we will decorate that small former sanctuary space appropriately for the season.

Thank you for your time and attention and for understanding of what our vision is for decorating the worship space. We know the Sacred Heart of Jesus banner has become very popular so we will keep that fact under advisement as we make future decisions regarding our worship space. It does much to supplement our Statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus which is located nearest the door at the southwest exit of the Church.




How to grow in intimacy with Our Father who loves us



Sharing the Gospel


