Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the past year and five months that I have been pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes, I am so inspired by the faith of our parishioners. Also, the volunteerism is wonderful and your love for the parish is clearly seen.

Each Sunday, when the parish family gathers in the church before Mass, it is great to see the enthusiasm parishioners have when they greet one another. You can see the warmth and love among you which gives me joy. While this is a gift indeed, at the same time, I would like to offer an additional reflection on this.

I know there are people who come early to church to prepare themselves spiritually before the next Mass begins. Some may even be carrying burdens and need time to pour out their hearts to the Lord. It is difficult for them to do this due to the noise level of those who are speaking in the church. I would like to suggest that 15 minutes before the Mass begins, the church becomes a place of quiet prayer. Perhaps we can reserve the narthex (*church lobby*) for the place to have conversation before the Mass begins. This would meet the needs of both groups of parishioners: those who would like to share with others before the Mass and those who would like to pray. Therefore, starting the first weekend of Advent, December 2nd, the cantor will invite everyone into a time of sacred silence fifteen minutes before the Mass begins, so we can ready ourselves for the sacred encounter with God.

Thank you for assisting one another in creating an atmosphere where everyone can prepare their hearts to meet Jesus.

Gifts From Bethlehem: Olivewood Handcrafted from the Holy Land November 9-10 in the All Purpose Room after all Masses.

A Traditional Art and Livelihood for Holy Land Christians.



The handicrafts trade evolved as a cultural tradition of Christians in the Holy Land for many centuries. This indigenous form of art has since become an industry of great importance to the local people of the Holy Land who rely on it for livelihood, and to Christian pilgrims from all around the world whose holy pilgrimage can be memorialized for a lifetime in cherished olivewood or mother of pearl souvenirs. The olivewood carving market is the major source of income in the Bethlehem area. More than 65 percent of the income of the community in Bethlehem comes from this work. In recent years, however, the holy crafts trade has suffered many hardships due to

social and economical pressures. Because of a sharp fall in tourism and also as a result of diminishing numbers of craftsmen who leave their traditional trade and emigrate due to the difficult conditions in their homeland, the Holy Land handicraft market is facing serious danger, and so is the Christian community in the Holy Land. Sixty five years ago, Christians represented more than 28% of the total population in the Holy Land, today they are less than 1.5%. The loss of Christians in the land of Christianity's birth represents a tragedy of immeasurable proportions for the billions of Christians worldwide. Thank you for your vital support for a Christian tradition and in protecting this very important culture and industry.



DID YOU KNOW

In Persona Christi - How can the Priest consecrate the Eucharist?

In Persona Christi: Did you know that the principal priest in every Mass is Jesus Christ? In Catholicism, a priest acts in the person of Christ in pronouncing the words that are part of the sacramental rite of the liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass. This is called being "In Persona Christi." In those moments, the Priest is in representation of the Lord by virtue of his ordination. At the Priest's ordination he is anointed with Holy Oil like the prophets of old. The Holy Spirit is called upon him so at the Mass he can act in the name of Jesus Christ. He is given the power from Heaven to be Christ at the moment he speaks the words of institution at Holy Mass. Christ's words effect reality when spoken. For example, (when Jesus said, Lazarus, come out of the tomb, he came out. When he said to the dead girl, arise, she rose up. When the priest says, "This is my body"..., they are Jesus' words. Jesus is saying them at the Mass through the Priest who stands in Persona Christi and so the bread becomes Jesus' body. The wine becomes his blood. The priest can never consecrate the wine and bread or absolve any sins on his own power. Rather, it is done through the power of Christ in him.








2024 Catholic Faith Network Award of Excellence

Sharing the Gospel


