Advent at OLL!

Happy New Liturgical Year! You may have noticed a few differences in the way we pray and decorate the church during the season of Advent. These elements in our Advent liturgies allow us to focus more as we prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth.



Liturgy:

- Our priests and deacons will wear the color purple or violet except for the Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) when rose vestments may be worn.
- We will begin our practice of entering a time of sacred silence, fifteen minutes prior to the start of Mass, as a way to prepare ourselves for our encounter with God during the celebration.
- + We do not sing or recite the Gloria except during solemnities such as the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (celebrated on Monday, Dec 9 this year) and the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (Dec 12).
- Our liturgical music, in general, will take on a simpler tone to reflect the season.

Church Environment & Other Elements:

- Contrary to the secular world, the church decor during Advent is much more modest to represent this season of preparation.
- + Our parish Advent Wreath will be lit at all liturgies. The candles represent Christ who is the light of the world and the wreath's evergreen boughs remind us of new and eternal life in Christ, the eternal son of the Father. At the weekend Masses, families will participate in the lighting of the Advent Wreath.
- + No flowers should be placed in church during Advent. The only exceptions are on the solemnities mentioned above and on Gaudete Sunday, the Third Sunday of Advent, December 15. Note: Flowers brought to church for funeral masses will be removed following the funeral.

Additional Advent Traditions to help you prepare...

- Help fellow parishioners in need by taking a tag from our parish Giving Tree in the All Purpose Room.
- Attend the Diocesan-wide Day of Reconciliation on Monday, December 23. Check elsewhere in the bulletin or our website for more information.
- ... take part in other Advent activities in our parish, such as Advent Lessons & Carols on Thursday, December 5, the Frassati Young Adult Group's Paint & Sip Night on Saturday, December 7 and Breakfast with St Nicholas on Sunday, December 8. Please see the bulletin, our parish website at www.ollchurch.org or our Facebook page for additional information.

As we journey together through these four weeks of Advent, let us mindfully work to prepare our hearts and homes for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.





Did You Know

Bread from Heaven — How is the Eucharist is similar to the "manna in the desert?"

In the Book of Exodus, God provided the Israelites with manna or "bread from Heaven." The Bible describes manna as a wet dew that appeared in the morning which the Israelites made into cakes that provided for their physical needs. Initially, the Israelites "grumbled" and "complained" over the manna but eventually recognized that the manna was a gift that came every day and was what they needed to survive and thrive. In the New Testament, Jesus compares himself to manna because He is our daily Eucharistic bread which satisfies our eternal and spiritual needs. Just as the Israelites were nourished by the "bread from Heaven," so are we nourished by the Eucharistic Bread from Heaven every time we approach the Lord's altar at Mass. Jesus also goes on to describe the difference between the manna their ancestors ate and the bread that he would give. He said, I am the bread of Life. Your ancestors ate manna in the desert, yet they died. If anyone eats of the bread that I will give, he will live forever. (See Exodus 16:4-36 and John 6:48-51)


