Did You Know
Blood of the Lamb—Why do we refer to Jesus as the Lamb of God?

When Jesus was thirsty on the cross, the soldiers gave him vinegar to drink which was on a hyssop branch. The hyssop branch was also used to put the blood of a Lamb on the door posts of the Jewish people the night of the Old Testament Passover. This blood was from the sacrificed Passover lamb. When the Spirit of death came to the houses of all the people in Egypt and saw the blood of the Lamb on the door post, it passed over those houses. Jesus' death on the Calvary Mountain was equivalent to the sacrifice of the Passover lamb.

During mass, we address Jesus as the Lamb of God because John the Baptist was the first to call him that. We recognize Jesus as the new Passover lamb who died for our sins. The Passover lamb in Egypt was sacrificed to spare the first-born sons of Israel, just as Jesus was the Passover Lamb who was sacrificed for all of humanity.

(John 1:29; Corinthians 5:6-7; Isaiah 53: 7-12)



Diocese of Rockville Centre Eucharistic Pilgrimage



- Begin the registration process by creating a Virtus account. The first screen requests the location: Please select Rockville Centre from the drop down list.
- Follow directions on each page.
- During the registration process you will receive a copy of the Code of Conduct and Pastoral Code of Conduct. Please sign each Code electronically.
- Select the class you wish to attend.
- Complete the background screening application provided. Background screening is conducted by Sterling Volunteers.

When you complete the registration process, you will have a Virtus account and an account with Sterling Volunteers. Your Virtus account will contain the date you signed the Codes of Conduct; date you submitted the background screening application and date you will attend Virtus. Please keep your username and the password for both your Virtus account and Sterling account as these are required to access each account.

From the time Mother Cabrini was a child, she dreamed of going to China as a missionary. As an adult she founded schools, hospitals, and orphanages in more than 40 locations for immigrants across three continents, but she never made it to the Far East. Nine years after Mother Cabrini's death, six Missionary Sisters entered China. Please join us for this special day of prayer. All are welcome.







Sharing the Gospel


